MULTIPLE INDICATOR CLUSTER SURVEY (MICS) PUNJAB, 2017-18 FOR DATA DRIVEN DECISION MAKING (DDDM)

for betterment of children and women and the society as a whole. MICS, 2017-18 gives statistically sound and internationally comparable estimates of various socio-economic indicators, required for monitoring goals & targets of the SDGs and other global commitments. The data/information, it has, will serve as a guideline for policy/decision makers to develop policies for betterment of the people of Punjab.

To promote the effective use of relevant and diagnostic data, Bureau of Statistics, Punjab had organized the 8 divisional workshops for identifying gaps and grey areas in social sector and facilitate planners and policy makers for more effective and efficient resource allocations & Data Driven Decision Making. In the workshop, technical personals and specialist were engaged to provide the basis for comparison of the progress in relation to various key socioeconomic indicators with previous rounds of MICS.







SURVEYS

ISLAMABAD CHILD LABOUR SURVEY (ICT CLS)

The formal approval by the Chairman Planning & Development (P&D) Board was given to Bureau of Statistics, Punjab to execute the ICT CLS survey. The survey tools like questionnaire and CAPI are developed. Desk testing of CAPI application has been carried out in the Headquarter BOS, Punjab. The survey is still in the process of further planning. A refresher training regarding questionnaire for the pre-testing team has been arranged on 1st December. Field testing was performed by the team on CAPI and PAPI in 2 clusters of Islamabad on 3rd-4th December 2021. A comprehensive feedback session on the observations by the team was conducted under the chairmanship of worthy Director General BOS Punjab, in the conference room of BOS Punjab on 6th December, 2021.





MICS 2017-18 SECONDARY & FURTHER ANALYSIS

The secondary analysis of the sector Water and Sanitation Hygiene (WASH) has already done and ready for use for policy/decision makers in Punjab. To extend this process, a meeting was conducted on June 28th, 2021 under the chairmanship of Director General, Bureau Statistics, Punjab where he suggested three thematic program sectors, for secondary and further analysis, which are Health (reproductive or immunization), Nutrition and School Education (Basic education). For the purpose of secondary and further analysis of MICS-2018 Punjab, a consultant was hired on specific TORs described by Social Policy & PMER Specialist, UNICEF.

SURVEYS

POSSIBLE SERIOUS BACTERIAL INFECTION (PSBI) SURVEY

UNICEF requested Bureau of Statistics (BoS), Punjab to conduct PSBI survey and to technically lead the whole activity within the timeline. BoS previously has conducted a similar study on PSBI assessment 2018 and in this continuation, UNICEF again requested BoS to technically lead the documentation study and analysis the gaps found Between baseline studies and current studies. BoS team has developed data collection tools. After receiving the data collected from the field through questionnaires, the data was entered in the excel database. Double data entry of the questionnaires was in order to ensure the accuracy of the data entered. Inconsistencies were removed from the data and the cleaned data had been further used for analysis purpose. Analysis consisted of the tables, scoring of the key features. PSBI index was calculated through these scoring parameters. To find the gaps between the baseline and current studies was one of the primary objective, in this regard; key features from the current data were compared with the baseline data. The final report is in the process and will be published by the end of February 2022.







PUNJAB HOME BASED AND DOMESTIC WORKERS SURVEY

The PC-II for the scheme titled "Punjab Home Based and Domestic Workers Survey" was approved by the PDWP on 25th November, 2021. This survey is being conducted upon request of the Labour & Human Resource Department, Punjab with technical support of the ILO. The survey would support the policy makers with following outcomes of the project:

- ♦ Data of domestic & home based workers available for government and other agencies to formulate policies & design projects to improve socioeconomic conditions of these workers.
- Quantitative and qualitative analysis report published covering, among other aspects, the number of domestic & home based workers and households that employ them, their socio-demographic profile, patterns and conditions of employment, contractual arrangements and recruitment patterns to assist the government to improve the protection of domestic & home based workers' rights and their working and living conditions.
- ♦ A broader framework developed for improving working conditions of Home-Based and Domestic workers.
- Implementation framework developed consisting of financial model for sustainable provision of social protection to these categories of workers and adequate legislative amendments proposed after legal gap analysis.

VISITS & MEETINGS

LAUNCHING CEREMONY OF PUNJAB GENDER PARITY REPORT 2019 & 2020

Mr. Sajid Rasul (Director General, BoS Punjab) attended the launching ceremony of "Punjab Gender Parity Report 2019 & 2020", organized by the Sub-National Governance Programme (SNG) and Punjab Commission on Status of Women (PCSW) on 7th December, 2021 at Avari Hotel Lahore. Chairman, Planning and Development Board Punjab, Mr. Muhammad Abdullah Khan Sumbal was chief guest of the ceremony. The purpose of workshop was to share the report with stakeholders and to dig-out data availability & gaps for assessment of situation regarding gender parity. The Chief Guest highlighted the importance of resource allocation and policy making on basis of credible

information in order to get the country towards right path of sustained development.

DG, BOS gave a presentation on "Data Gaps and Availability" for sharing with the participants important aspects of data, importance of data in decision making, data gaps in gender related SDGs indicators, surveys conducted by BOS Punjab, annual publications of the BOS, PunjabInfo database and the fundamental principles of official statistics.



VISIT OF DG BOS AT GOVERNMENT COLLEGE UNIVERSITY, LAHORE

Director General, Bureau of Statistics, Punjab (Mr. Sajid Rasul) gave a presentation on "Importance of Data" at Fazal Hussain Auditorium, Government College University, Lahore on 30th September, 2021. During the



presentation, he shared functions, responsibilities and role of the Bureau of Statistics, Punjab in supporting the policy makers. He highlighted the value of statistics in evidence-based decision making that how it can help in better outcomes of policies for the government. The Vice Chancellor GC University Lahore, Prof. Dr. Asghar Zaidi, was chief guest on the occasion, whereas Faculty Member and Students of the Department of Statistics participated in the workshop.


A REVIEW MEETING WITH DR. SALMAN SHAH ADVISOR TO CHIEF MINISTER ON ECONOMIC AFFAIRS AND PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT

Meeting regarding Departmental Review of Bureau of Statistics (BoS), Punjab was held on 11.10.2021 under chairmanship of Dr. Salman Shah Advisor to Chief Minister on Economic Affairs and P&D. DEVELOPMENT OF ONLINE STATISTICAL SYSTEM IN PUNJAB (OSSP)

A very visionary project titled "Development of Online Statistical System in Punjab (OSSP)" was initiated by Bureau of Statistics (BoS), Punjab, in collaboration with the Punjab Information Technology Board (PITB). The scheme was approved during 08th PDWP meeting, held on 03.09.2021 at a total cost of Rupees 484.848 Million. Key objectives of the scheme are as under:

- ♦ To analyze and identify data sources needed for implementing a government wide Master Data Repository (MDM Framework and BI Tools)
- ♦ To develop a standardized data strategy document for government of the Punjab
- ♦ To implement Master Data Management Framework and Business Intelligence (BI) tools in line with data strategy for government of the Punjab
- ♦ To develop Android Apps and Online Dashboard for key surveys carried out by BoS Punjab, to improve transparency and access to information
- ♦ To build capacity of relevant HR at BoS Punjab, for managing operations of MDM/BI platforms

A strong management structure has been adopted for successful completion of the project and overseeing the activities. Steering Committee (Headed by Chairman, P&D Board), Coordination Committee (Chaired by the Secretary, P&D Board) and Core Team at BoS Punjab has been notified, accordingly. A renowned firm has been procured through PPRA Rules for conducting the first phase of the project and the firm has started its work.

Hopefully, this project would prove to be significant contribution towards evidence based policy making in the province.






INTERNSHIP PROGRAM 2021

PUNJAB AGRICULTURE STATISTICS 2020


Bureau of Statistics, Punjab started publication of Punjab Agriculture Statistics since 2016-17 aimed at providing area, production of major crops (Both Rabi & Kharif) and year-to-year comparison and analysis. It also contains data about important agriculture inputs i.e. Rainfall, Temperature and Land Use Statistics including the details of un-irrigated and irrigated area by source of irrigation. In order to improve the scope of this publication, information about Area and Production of three additional Rabi Crops (i.e. Maize, Onion and Masoor) have been included in this edition.

LAND USE STATISTICS (LUS) 2020

Land use statistics (LUS) is bringing out computerized tabulation of Annual Land Use Statistics (Milane-Raqba) since 1987-1988 with the approval of the board of Revenue. The statistics provided in this report give wealth of information to the policy makers and government for assessment of land utilization in agriculture sector. It depicts a good picture of development taking place in agriculture in terms of status of land used utilization, irrigation sources and the area under cultivation. These statistics can be used to monitor the current situation of land utilization and for assessment of trends over past decade, as well.




MECHANICAL TABULATION REPORT OF RABI & KHARIF 2020-21




Agriculture Division has been publishing a regular report named Mechanical Tabulation Repot (MTR) since 1961-62. Mechanical Tabulation Report is the primary report of Agriculture Division. It mainly includes data regarding Area Sown, Un-Irrigated and irrigated area by source of irrigation and by crop of 149 tehsils, 36 districts, 9 divisions of Punjab. The final estimates of area sown under all crops are based on complete enumeration (Girdawari) of all Mouzas of Punjab carried out by Patwaris of Revenue Department twice a year, for each Kharif and Rabi season. Agriculture Division collects Crop Acreage Statistics (Goshwara Jinswar) through revenue patwaris by using the services of "The Director Land Records".




PUNJAB HEALTH STATISTICS 2021

PUNJAB EDUCATION STATISTICS 2019-20

The annual census of educational institutions covers all the Universities, Professional Colleges, Intermediate, Degree & Post Graduate Colleges, Higher Secondary, Punjab Daanish and Govt. Mosques, Primary, Middle and High Schools located in the Punjab. The information relating to number, enrolment and teaching staff is presented at Tehsil/District/Division level. The current report is based on the year 2019-20.

MONTHLY SURVEY OF INDUSTRIAL PRODUCTION & EMPLOYMENT IN THE PUNJAB

C.I.S division of this bureau has been preparing and publishing "Monthly Survey of Industrial Production & Employment in the Punjab" containing current production and employment data of industrial units in aggregates since October 1972. Moreover, with reference period from 1st July, 2021 to 31st December, 2021, C.I.S Division published reports for the month of May 2021 to August 2021 with a lag of 45 days. The report contains statistics regarding 45 important industries, manufacturing about 100 selected items, contributing 72% of the total value added of large-scale manufacturing sector in the province, based on base year 2005-06 and covers around 2041 industrial units from all over the Punjab. Pakistan Bureau of Statistics aims to rebased QIM from 2005-06 to 2015-16 and shared Punjab Frame and Punjab Sample as per CMI 2015-16 with BoS Punjab. After finalizing the questionnaire with joint consultation of BoS Punjab and PBS, CIS Division organized a zoom training session with all field offices Incharge and trained them for new CIS

coverage as per Punjab Sample Shared by PBS.

Price division of this bureau prepares one pager retail price templates (one each) for ten essential household use commodities. These templates increase interest and understanding of common person to go through the price trend in the province. These templates show daily, weekly, monthly, fortnightly, yearly and regional comparison of price statistics. These are developed on weekly basis and shared with different concerned departments.

PREPARATION OF PROVINCIAL GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT (GDP) 2020-21 ESTIMATES

Gross Domestic Product (GDP) is a major indicator to plan, analyze and monitor progress in the development of an economy. Estimation of GDP at provincial level is pivotal for planning and monitoring of economic development in the province. Bureau of Statistics, Punjab has been preparing provincial GDP estimates of Punjab since 1999-2000, by following System of National Accounts. The GDP estimates for the year 2020-21 were prepared as per regular routine.
