Preface

Southern Punjab (Saraikistan) is a majority of Saraiki speakers in the southern and western part of Punjab province. The proposed territorial extent generally includes 3 Divisions Bahawalpur, Dera Ghazi Khan and Multan, consists of 11 districts of Punjab (Bahawalpur, Bahawalnagar, Rahim Yar Khan, Dera Ghazi Khan, Layyah, Muzaffargarh, Rajanpur, Multan, Lodhran, Khanewal, Vehari). As the Government is stepping towards the formation of this province, the Bureau of Statistics Punjab has taken an initiative to produce a standalone publication “South Punjab Development Statistics 2024” along with the Punjab Development Statistics 2024.



This 5th edition provides important statistics concerning social, economic, and financial sectors of the economy at aggregate as well as sectoral levels. This publication contains data on almost all sectors of the Provincial economy with their break-up by Tehsil, District & Division of southern Punjab, as far as possible. It includes some national data on important subjects like Major Crops, Foreign Trade, Labour Force & Employment, National Accounts, Population, Price, and Transport, etc.

It contains a 'Statistical Abstract' which gives a comparative picture of information on almost all Socio-Economic sectors of Pakistan, Punjab and South Punjab. Key findings of Multiple Indicator Cluster Survey (MICS), Punjab 2017-18 for some of the Socio-Economic Indicators are also part of this edition such as Education, Health, Housing and Socio-Economic Development by the district.

One additional table of Mineral Production and Price the South Punjab have been incorporated in this edition. Moreover tables related to Population and Housing Census have been updated in this edition. This edition features updated tables that reflect the most recent data from Population and Housing census 2023, providing a comprehensive overview of latest population and household characteristics. Every effort has been made to include the latest available data in this publication. It is hoped, it will be useful for the Policy Makers, Planners, Researchers, Govt. Departments, and other Socio-Economic data users in the public as well as the private sector.

I am thankful to the Provincial Departments / Agencies / Federal Ministries / Divisional /District offices for the timely supply of required data, as, without their co-operation, it would not be possible to release this publication in time. The efforts of the staff of Bureau of Statistics, Punjab in producing this Publication are also highly appreciated.

EXPLANATORY NOTES ON AGRICULTURE SECTION

Agriculture sector mainly comprises of Agriculture & Metrology, detailed description & definitions of the relevent terms are given below along with each headings:

A- Agriculture

This sub-section includes data on the following topics:-

- 1 Land Utilization
- 2 Agricultural Farms
- 3 Agricultural Inputs (Temperature, Rainfall, Canal With-drawals, Sales, Nutrients Per Kg. and Prices of Fertilizers, Distribution of Improved Seeds and Area Treated with Pesticides)
- 4 Tubewells Installed, Electrified and Pumping in Scarps Areas; their Pumpage Capacity and Actual Pumpages
- 5 Tractors by Ownership and Imports of Tractors
- 6 Agricultural Institutional Credit
- 7 Cropped Area and Area irrigated by Different Modes of Irrigation, Total Area Sown under various Crops (Total and Irrigated) and Area Failed
- 8 Production and Per Hectare Yield of Important Crops. Area and Production of Various Oil Seeds, Fruit and Other Minor Crops
- 9 Water Table Depths Production and Per Hectare Yield of Important Crops. Area & Production of Various Oil Seeds

The collection and compilation of Land Utilization, Crop Acreage and Production data are explained below:-

a) Land Utilization

Land Utilization Statistics are compiled from the returns supplied by the tehsil offices based upon summarisation of crop inspection data entered in Form-I of "**Lal Kitab**" of each Revenue Estate through Computer processing in this Bureau.

Definitions of the terms used in the Land Utilization Statistics are given below:-

- i) **Total Area Reported** means the total physical area of the village/deh, tehsil or district etc. It includes cultivated area (net area sown + current fallow), culturable waste, unculturable land and forest area.
- ii) **Forest Area** means the area of any land classed or administered as forest under any legal enactment dealing with forests. Any cultivated area which may exist within such forest should be excluded and shown under the heading cultivated area.
- iii) **Total Cropped Area** means the sum total of area sown during Kharif and Rabi seasons during a given year including Zaid Kharif and Zaid Rabi.
- iv) **Not Available For Cultivation** means the land absolutely barren, roads, canals, tanks, beds of rivers, torrents and ravines, sites of villages, houses, hills, mountains, sand dunes and all land devoted to uses alien to agriculture.

- (vi) **Cultivated Area** means the land currently being used for agricultural purposes, including land under crops, orchards as well as current fallow. It is the area net sown plus current fallow.
- (vii) **Current Fallow** means the part of the cultivated area which has not been used for cropping during the year under reference but for which the total vacant period does not exceed three crop seasons. The land remaining vacant for more than three successive seasons should be shown under the head 'culturable waste'
- (viii) **Net Area Sown** means the area which has been sown at least once in a year. It will include area under crops, fruit, vegetables etc.
- (ix) **Area Sown More Than Once** means the difference between the total cropped Area and net sown i.e. the difference between (iii) and (viii).

b) Area Under Crops

Census of Crop Acreage is conducted by the Revenue Patwaries, twice a year, one for Kharif Season and other for Rabi Season in all about 25914 Mauzas of the Punjab Province and 201 Mauzas of Islamabad. The Mauza-wise Crop Acreage Returns (Goshwara Jinswars) prepared manually by the Patwaries, are collected by the Bureau of Statistics, through Director Land Records from the Tehsildars. These returns are checked by the Bureau for completeness of coverage, edited, coded and entered in Computer. Credibility checks are applied at mauza level with the help of the computer. These statistics are utilized by the Agriculture Department in the preparation of final production estimates. It may, however, be mentioned that 'Zaid Rabi' crops like Tobacco and Onion are not fully covered through this census as separate crop inspection is carried for these crops. The manually compiled acreage of these crops by the Revenue staff is used for preparation of the final estimates of these crops.

c) Production of Crops

For Wheat, Cotton, Rice, Maize and Sugarcane, the Agriculture Department conducts Random Crop-Cutting Surveys. The observed data of these Surveys are edited in the light of available data on weather conditions, availability of water, use of fertilizers and other agricultural inputs. The survey estimates of yield-rates are then modified and utilized to prepare 'Official' production estimates.

For other crops, the yield-rates are estimated on the basis of farmers opinion surveys and edited with the help of data on inputs, rainfall and weather conditions etc. The yield-rates thus arrived at are then applied to estimate the 'Official' estimates of total out-turn of the respective crops.

d) Source of Irrigation

According to the Assessment Rules, 1968; in the West Pakistan Land Revenue ACT, 1967, the following sources of irrigation are described as:

- i) Barani-dependent of rainfall
- ii) Sailab-flooded or permanently moist by rivers
- iii) Rod-Kohi-watered from hill torrents
- iv) Abi-watered lift from tanks, jhils, streams, by flow from springs or karezes
- v) Nehri (Canals)- irrigated by canals by flow or lift
- vi) Chahi (Well)-watered from wells
- vii) Chahi-nehri (Canal-Wells)- irrigated partly from well and partly from a canal
- viii) Nul-chahi (Tube-well) -watered from tube-wells

B- Meteorology

The sub-section includes mean of minimum and maximum temperatures at selected stations from 2012 to 2021. The rainfall at the specified stations is recorded in millimeters instead of inches & cents ("1 = 25.4 Millimeters) at 0500, 0800 and 1700 Hours. PST daily by the Meteorological Observatories.

The Meteorological Observations recorded daily at different hours are copied by the Observers in Monthly Meteorological Register and this Register is sent to Regional Centre at 46-Gulberg Road, Lahore in the first week of each succeeding month. These Registers are then thoroughly scrutinized by the trained Meteorological Staff at Lahore and corrections are applied, where ever necessary.

The sums, averages and extreme (maximum & minimum) values of all the Meteorological Observations are also worked out by the scrutinising staff. On the basis of these monthly values over a long period of 30 years the normal values are worked out.

C- Limitations

The timely availability of statistics depends on two factors, first, the receipt of reports from the Field Staff and secondly, their tabulation at the Provincial level. As far as the acreage under various crops is concerned, the Bureau of Statistics has been trying to reduce the time-lag by collecting mauza-wise Goshwara Jinswars directly from the Revenue Field Staff through Director Land Records and by minimizing the tabulation time. The centralized collection and tabulation has reduced tabulation time appreciably.

Most of the agricultural statistics are by-products of the administrative activities of the Revenue Department. Since the collection of Statistics is not primary aim of the Revenue Department, the system has not provided for quality control on statistics derived from its records. The compilation of figures at all levels is done manually which undoubtedly contains errors of coverage, classifications, summations etc.

Note: Kharif and Rabi Crop Seasons run from April to September and October to March respectively.

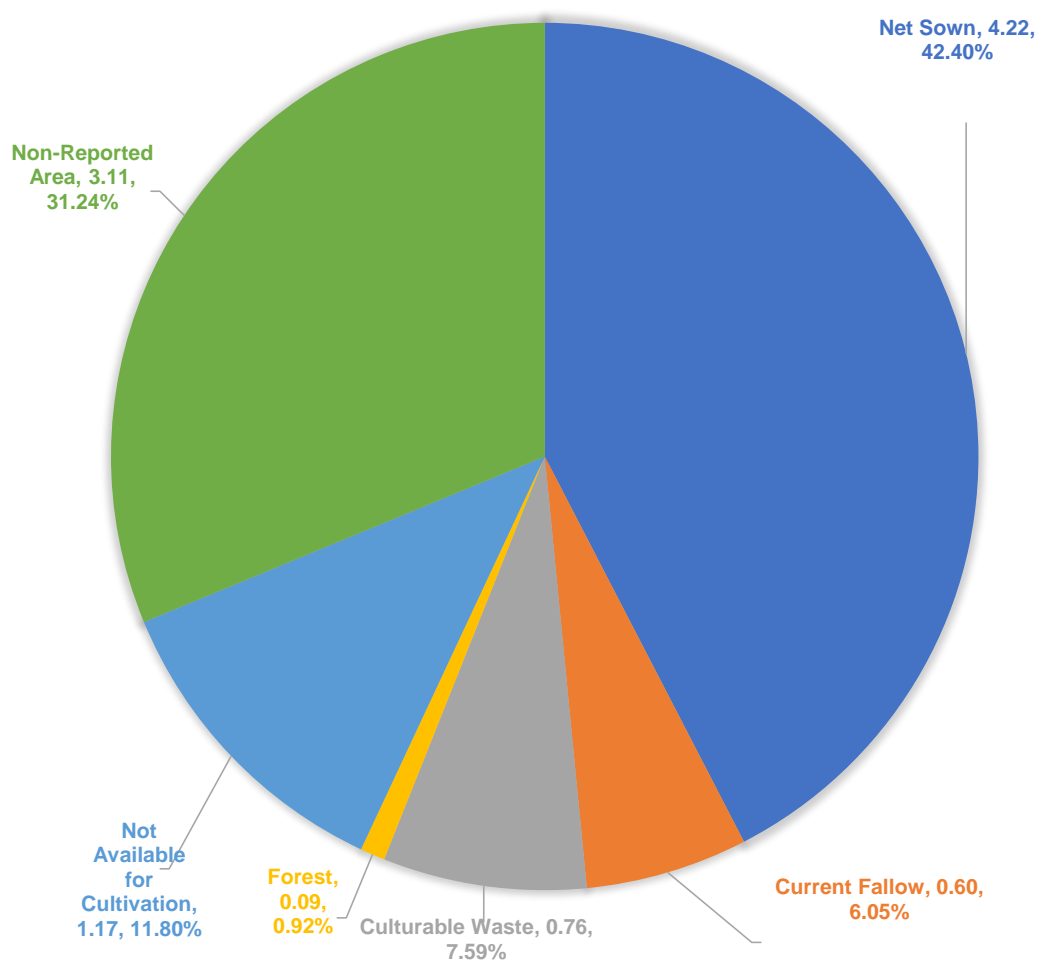

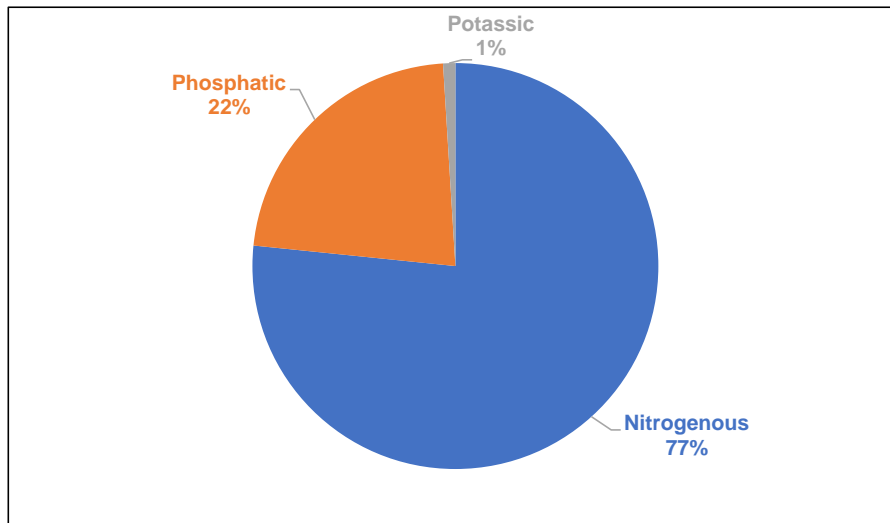

TOTAL : Thousand N. Tons 1465

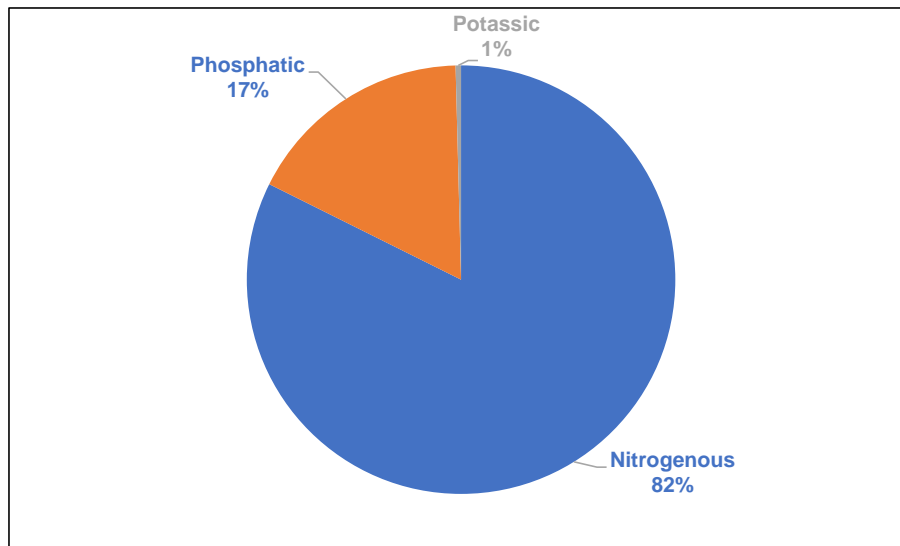

TOTAL CROPPED AREA : 6998 ('000' HECTARES)**

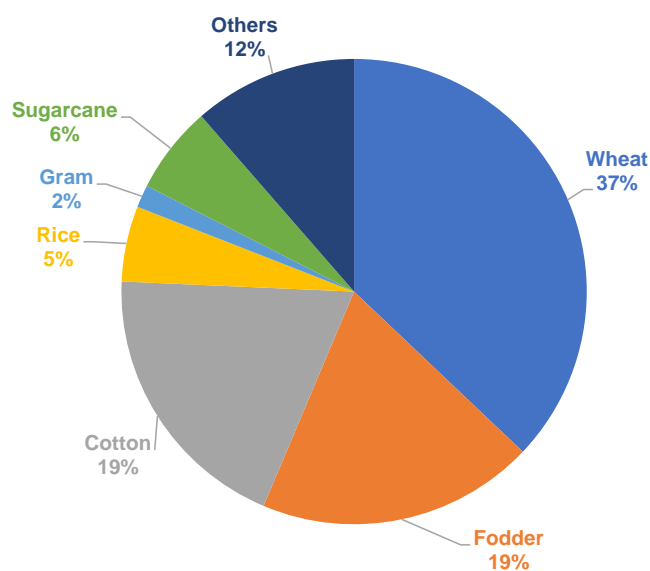

2018-19 TO 2022-23**

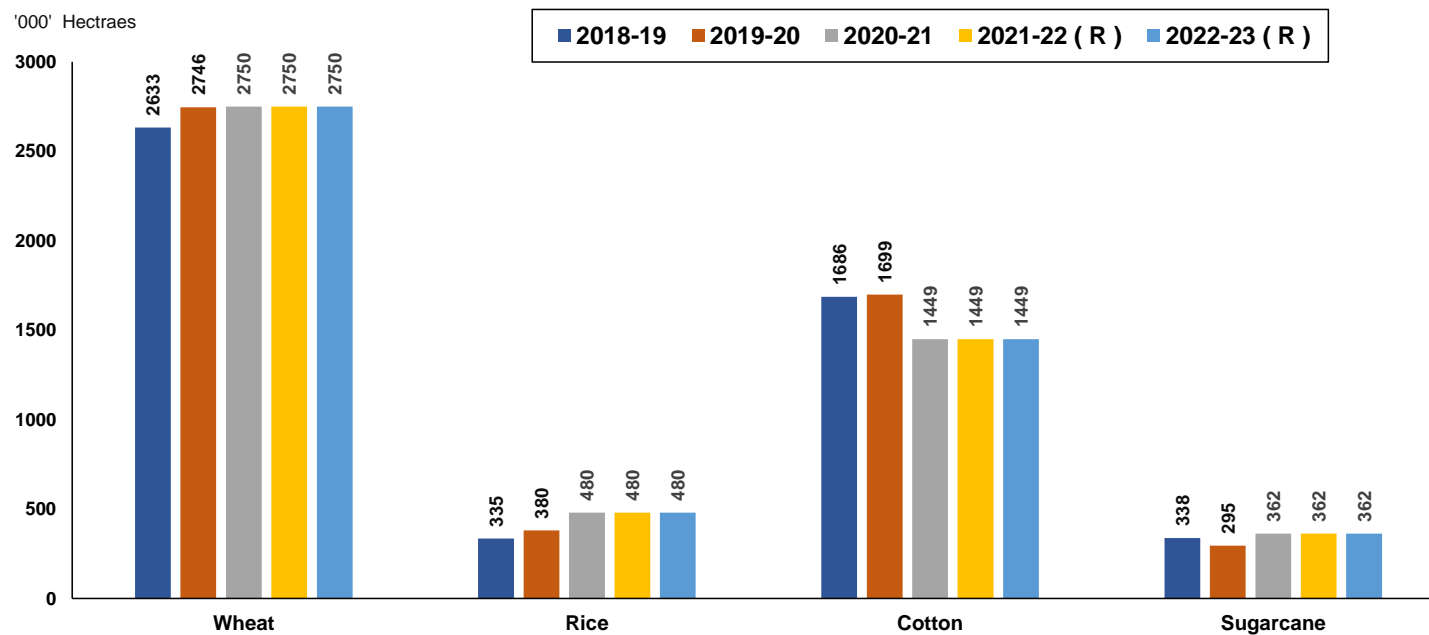

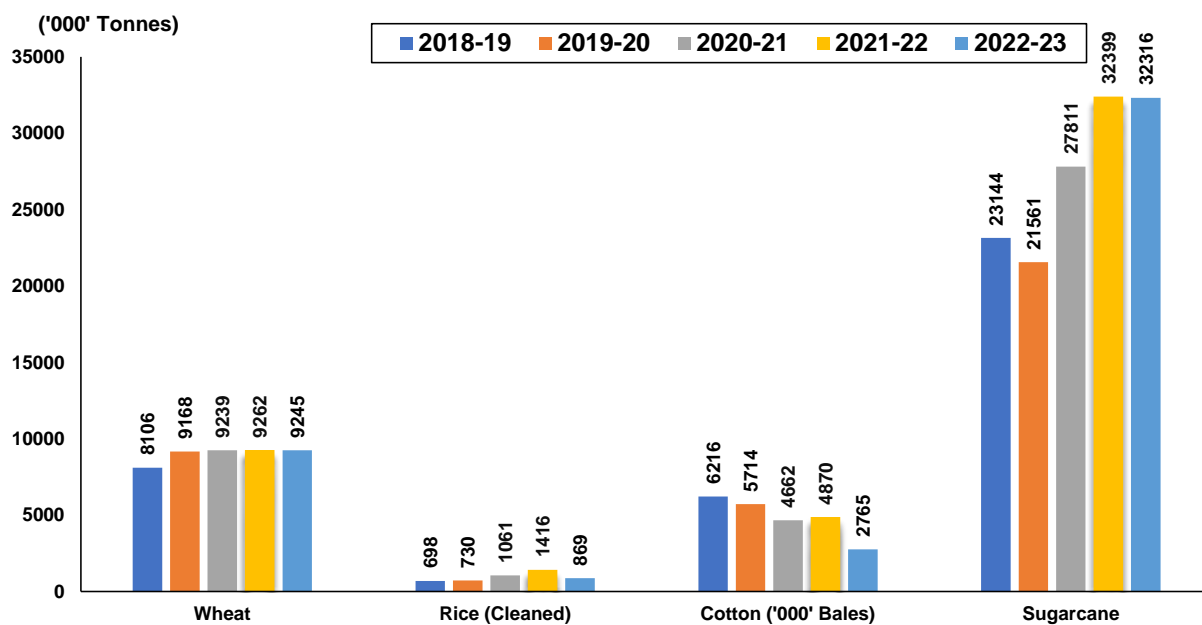

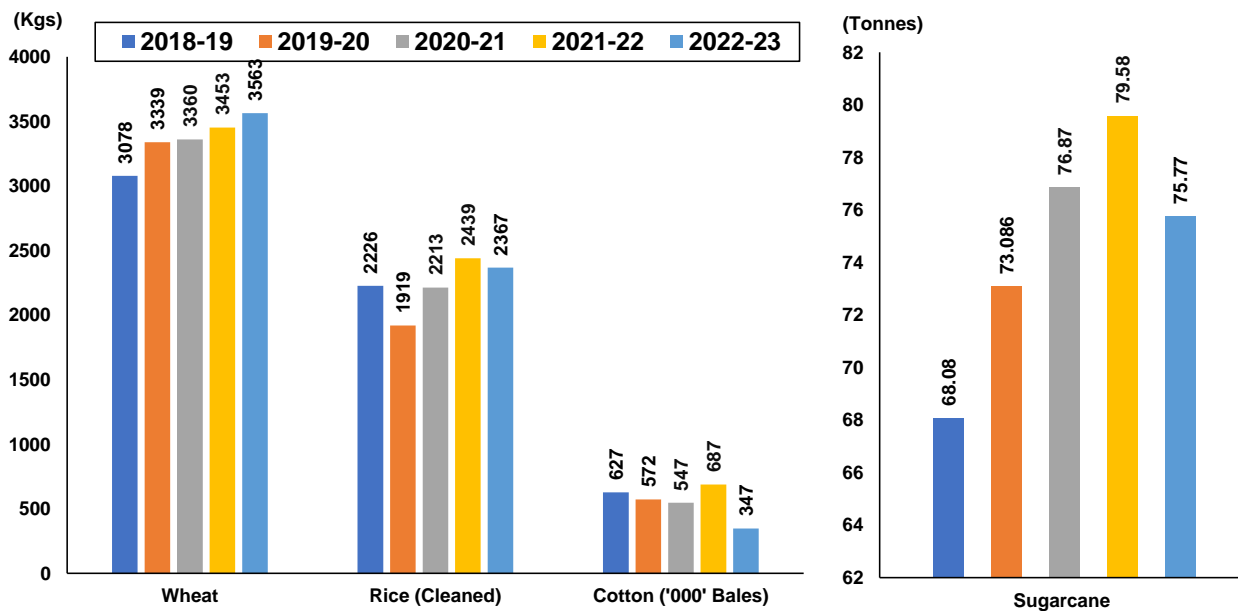

FIGURE 1.7: PRODUCTION OF IMPORTANT CROPS, PAKISTAN & SOUTH PUNJAB: 2022-23

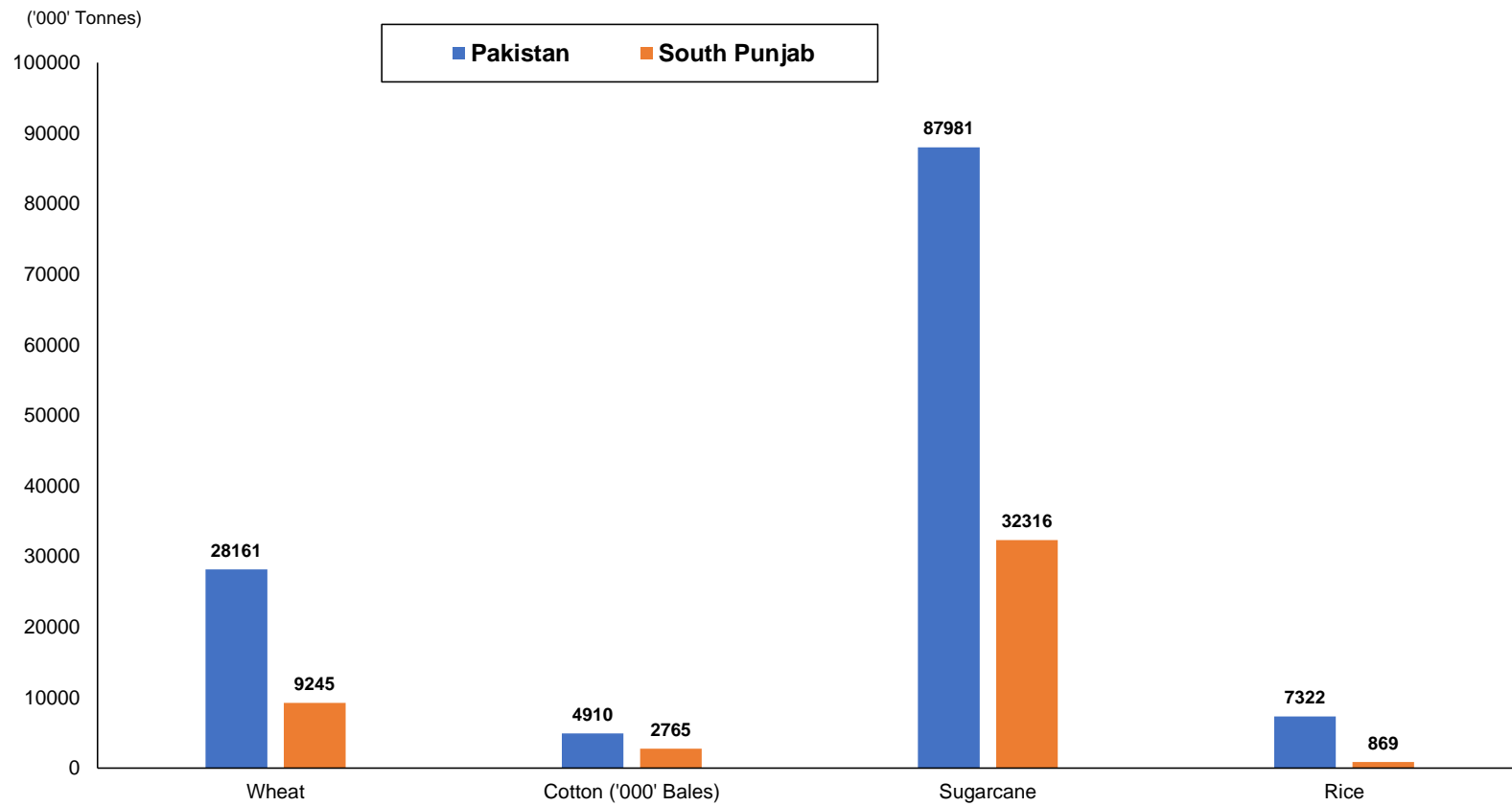

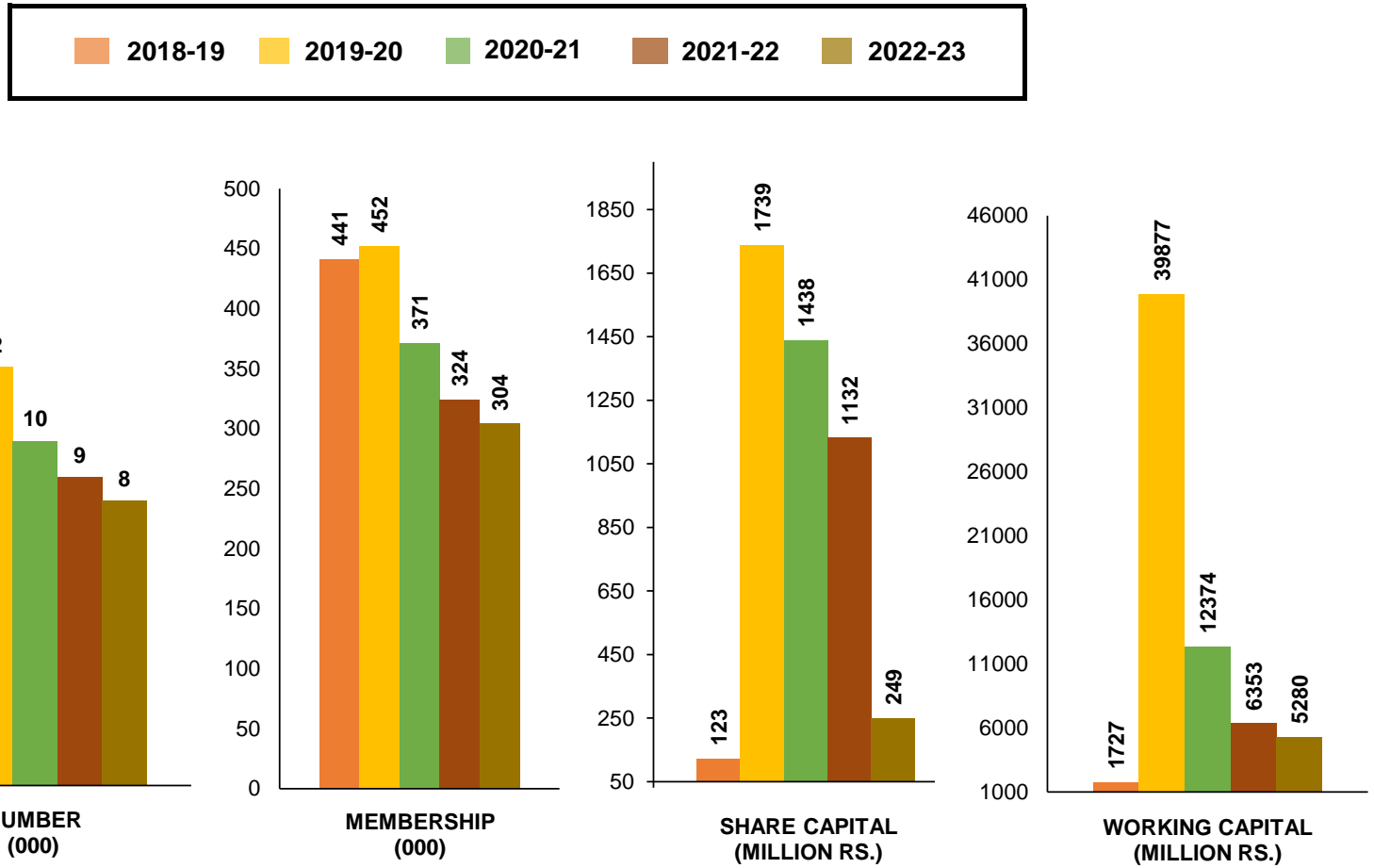

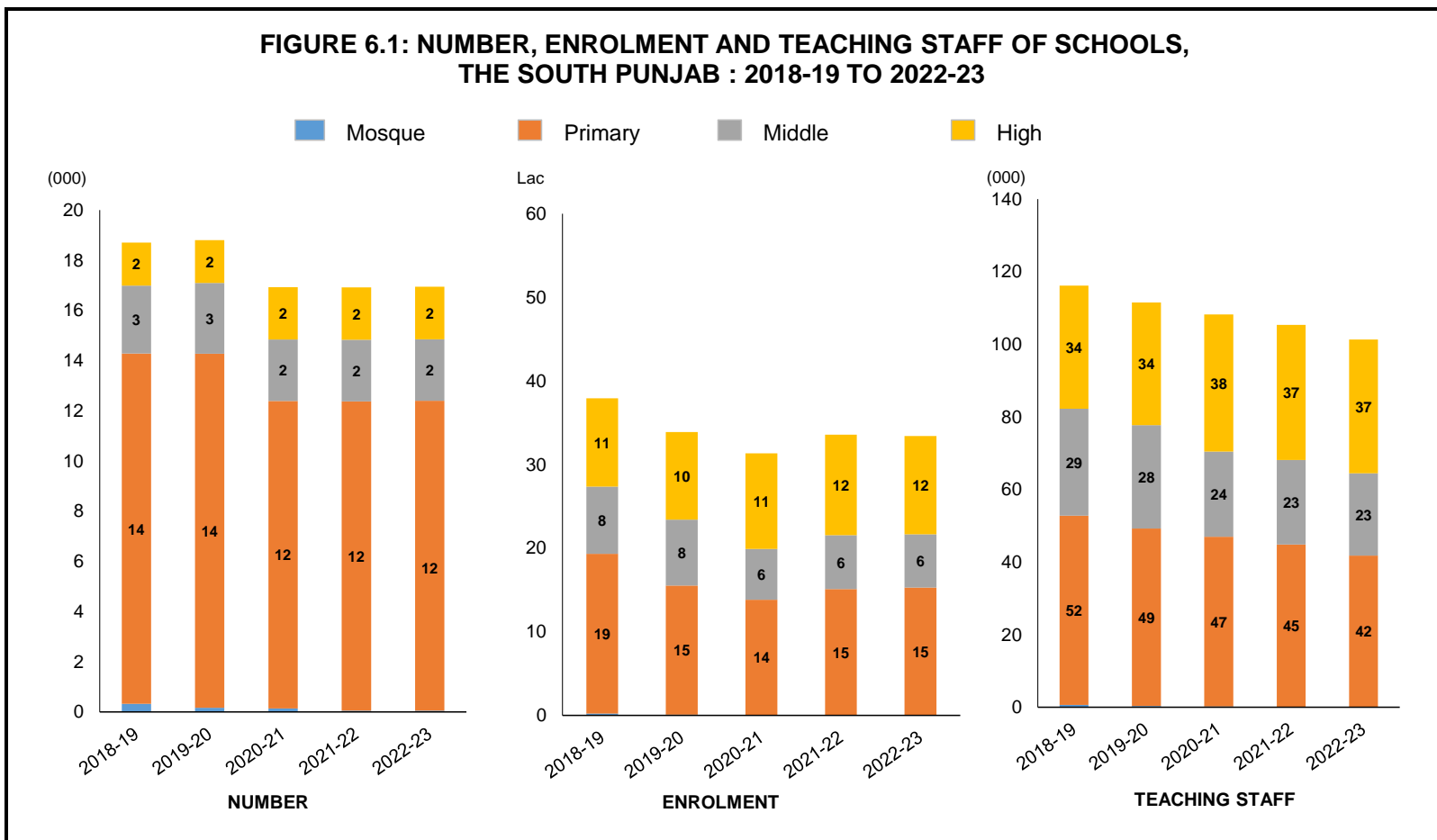

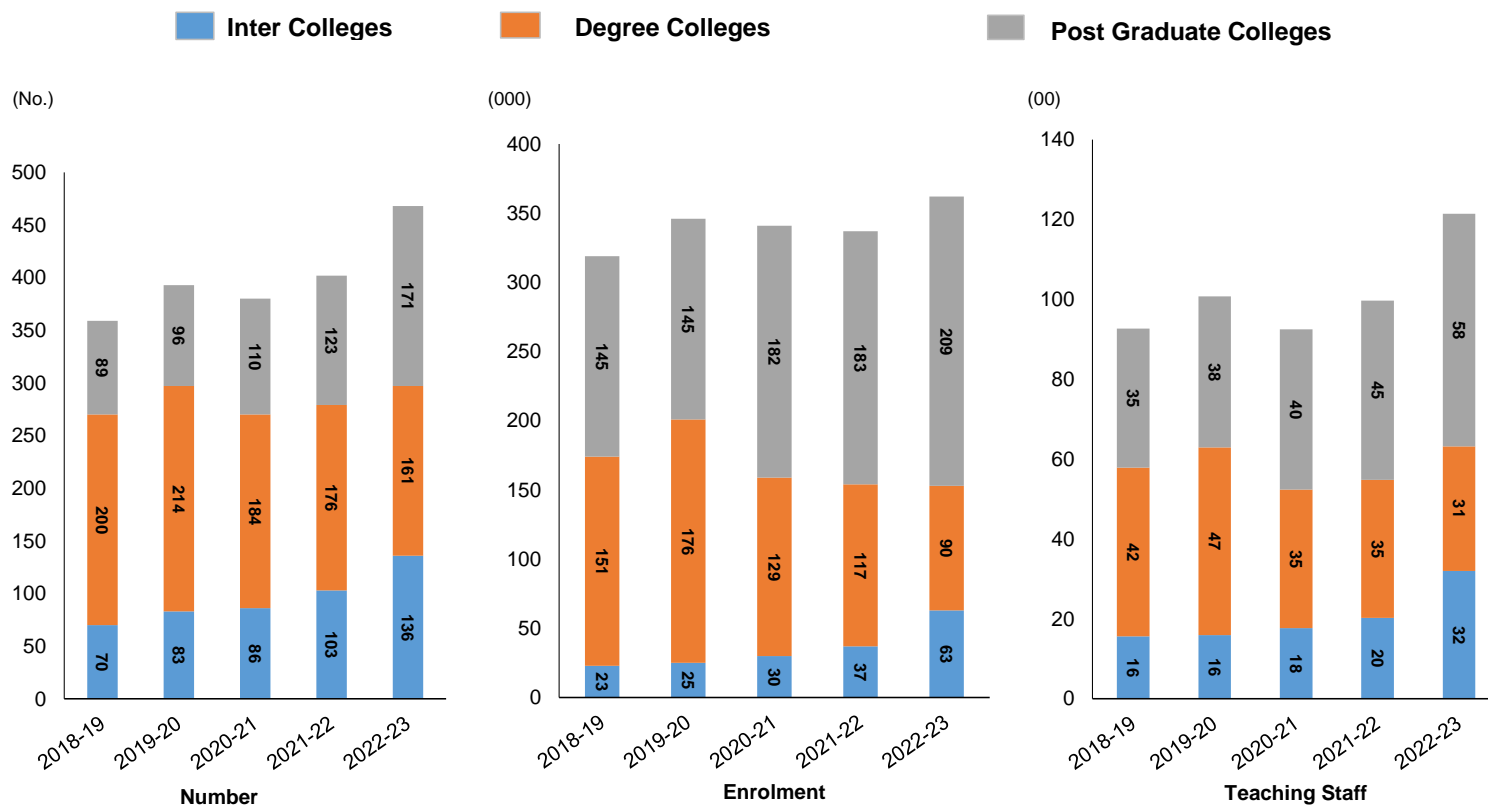

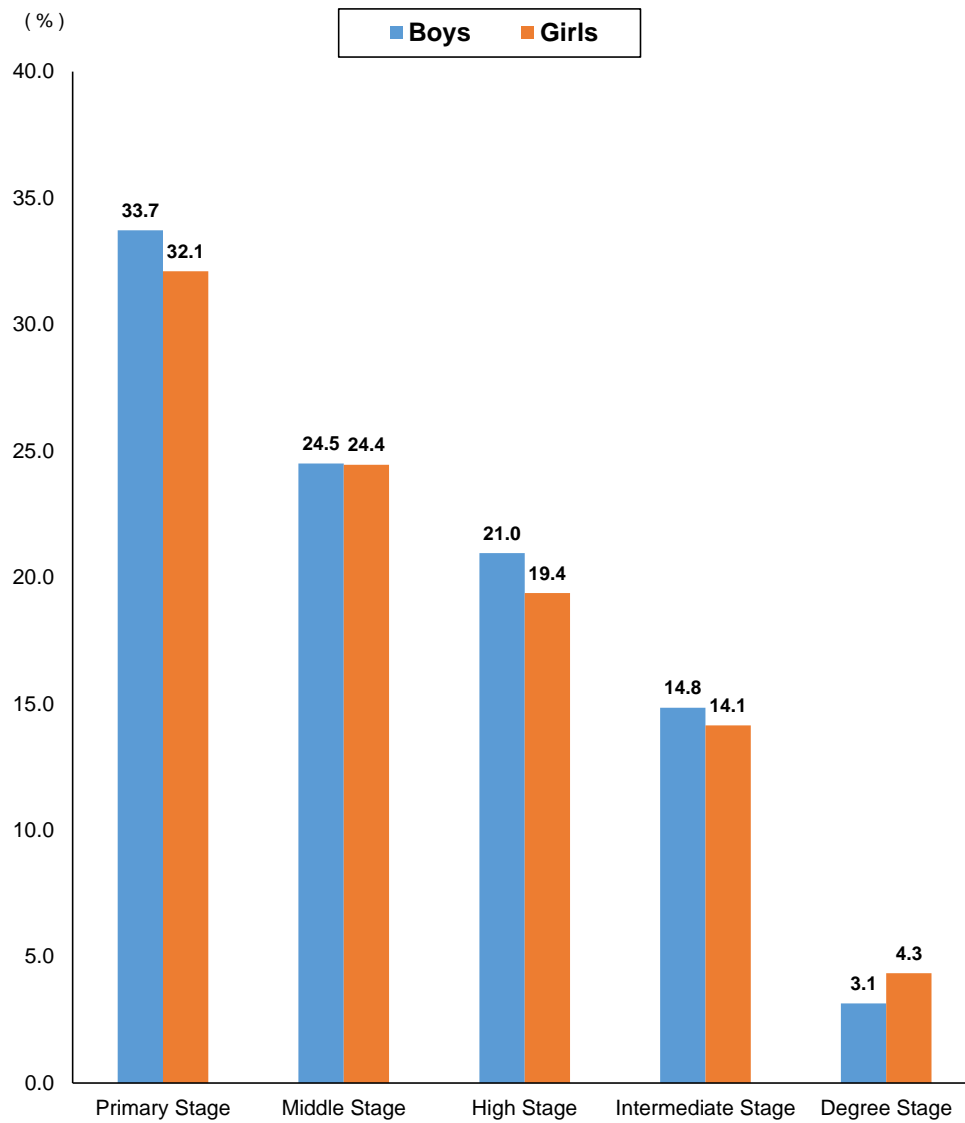

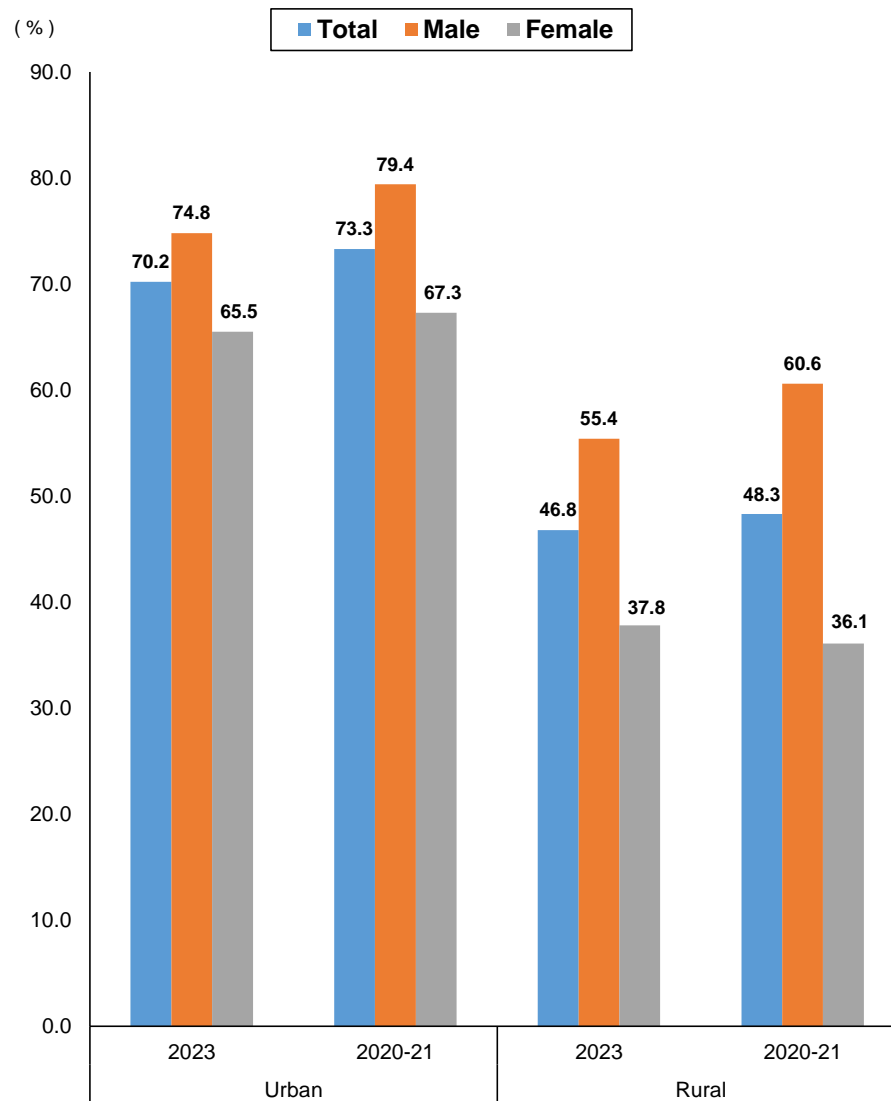

EXPLANATORY NOTES ON FOODGRAINS SECTION

This section includes data on the following topics:-

- 1) Procurement of Wheat by Food Department on Voluntary basis.
- 2) Procurement of Wheat by PASSCO on Voluntary Basis.
- 3) Wheat Imports.
- 4) Release of Wheat from Provincial Reserves
- 5) Stocks of Wheat in Provincial Reserves.
- 6) Available Foodgrains Storage Capacity.

These data are supplied by the District Offices of the Food Department on the basis of records maintained by them. Wheat offered voluntarily by growers, zamindars, traders, agents etc., is purchased at the procurement price fixed by the Government at the Procurement Centres established by the Food Department and PASSCO for the purpose.

Releases of wheat from Government Reserves mainly relate to the wheat issued to Roller Flour Mills for milling and sale to consumers through fair price shops at fixed prices. Wheat is also released to Roller Flour Mills to supplement the supplies of wheat flour available in the open market. These releases are issued as a measure to stabilize open market prices of wheat and wheat atta.

Stocks of wheat on the 1st of every month indicate the size of buffer stocks maintained by the Government as a level against rise in prices of wheat and wheat atta in the market.

The wheat procurement year runs from May to April following wheat harvesting of previous Rabi season.

EXPLANATORY NOTES ON FOREIGN TRADE SECTION

Foreign trade statistics refer to the movement of goods into and out of the customs area of Pakistan and include imports, re-imports, exports and re-exports carried through sea, land and air routes but exclude trade in-transit through Pakistan.

Import statistics represent arrival of goods of foreign origin from foreign countries into Pakistan and are released by customs (either directly or indirectly after storage in bonded warehouses) and intended for home consumption or for re-exportation. Goods salvaged from or disposed off by ships in mid-stream are included in the imports from the country according to the color of the ship. Diplomatic privileged imports and imports by parcel posts are also included in imports. Exported goods subsequently imported from foreign countries without any processing are treated as re-import which are tabulated and presented separately. However, imports into band not valued military goods, goods of no commercial value, gold and silver Coins or bullion and currency notes, article of baggage and personnel effects of passenger and trade in-transit through Pakistan are excluded from import statistics. Import are valued at Cost, Insurance and Freight (CIF).

Export statistics represent the movement of goods out of Pakistan of foreign countries through lawful channels as emerge from customs documents. Re-export statistics represent imported goods subsequently exported to foreign countries without further processing which are tabulated and presented separately. Supplies and bunker fuels to ships are included in exports according to the color of the ships. Exports by parcel posts are also included. However, not valued military goods, relief goods/goods of no commercial values, sales from duty free shops and trade with Isrel, gold and silver coins or bullion and currency notes, non dutiable articles of baggage's and personnel effects of passenger, Trade in-transit through Pakistan are not included in exports. Trade data of Karachi Export Processing Zone (KEPZ) are being included in National Trade Statistics from July, 2003.

Export are valued at Free on Board (FOB) upto June, 2002 commodities of export and import were classified on the basis of Pakistan Standard Trade Classification (PSTC-R3). From July, 2002, commodities of export and import are being classified according to Harmonized Commodity Description and coding system (HS-02) for compilation and dissemination of data to national and international users.

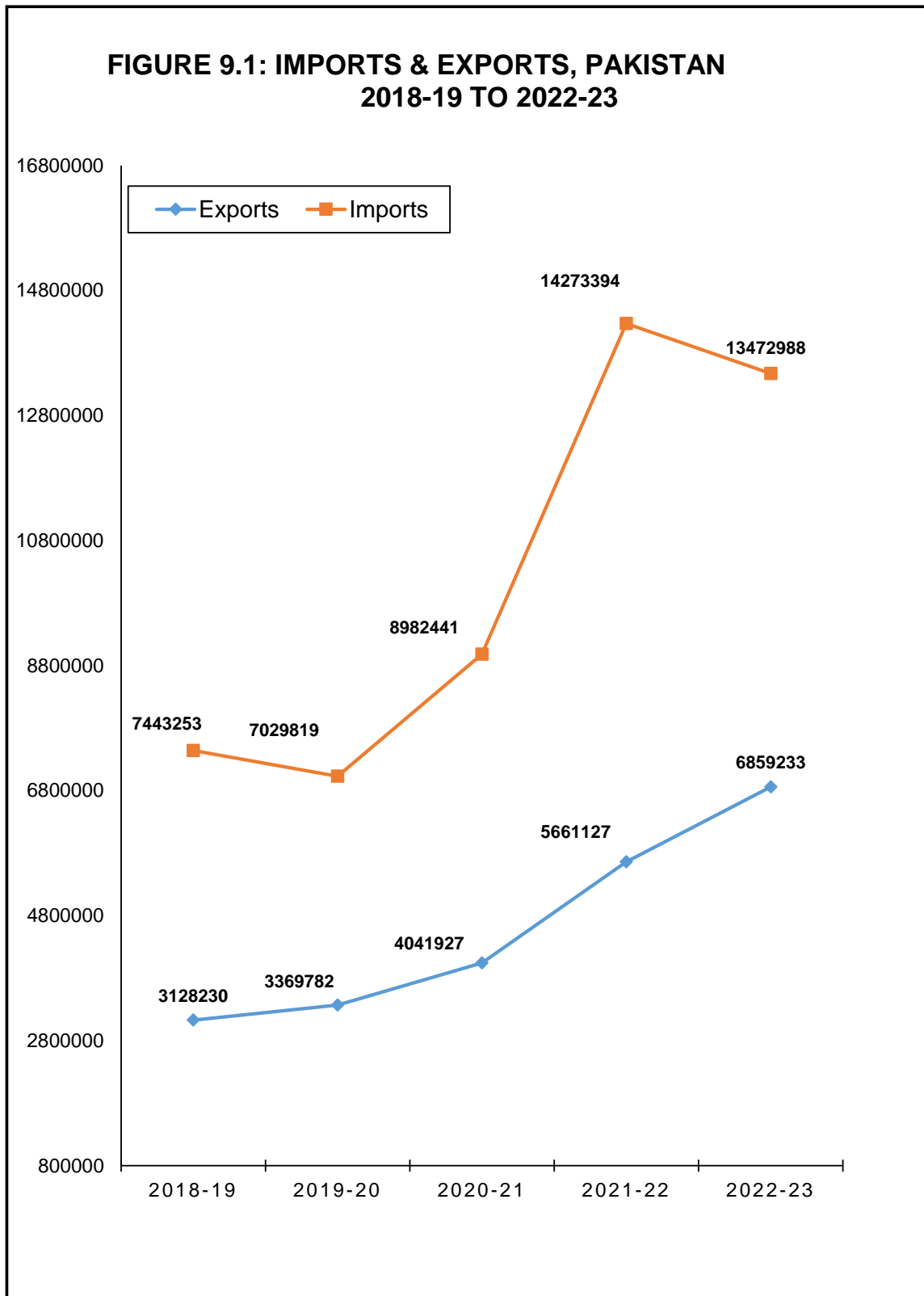

EXPLANATORY NOTES ON FOREST SECTION

The data included in this Section cover the designated forest areas by legal status and the out-turn and value of timber & firewood produced from the same.

A- Designated Forest Areas

These include all the wooded and non-wooded areas and the barren lands which are under the administrative control of the Punjab Forest Department for the afforestation and management purposes. It includes all the coniferous forests, scrub forests, riverian forests, irrigated plantations, linear plantations and range lands.

The brief definitions of the categories of the Forest areas by legal status are:-

i) **Reserved Forests**

The forest area under the control of the Forest Department declared as Reserved Forest under the Forest Act, 1927. The rights and privileges are normally limited and settled.

ii) **Protected Forests**

The forest area under the control of Forest Department which has been declared as Protected Forest under the Provision of Forest Act, 1927.

iii) **Un-Classed Forests**

The Government Forests which are neither Reserved Forests nor Protected Forests.

iv) **Section-38 Area**

Private land area handed over voluntarily by the owners to the Forest Department for management under Section-38 of Forest Act, 1927.

v) **Chos Act Area**

Land taken up for soil and water conservation under the Chos Act.

vi) **Resumed Lands**

Land taken over by Government under various Reforms or Martial Law Regulations.

vii) **Guzara Forests**

The Forest area which are the joint property of the villagers and are being managed presently by the Forest Department.

Definitions of some Vegetational types of Forests are given below:-

i) **Coniferous Forests**

Natural forests of cone bearing trees with usually needle like leaves mostly occurring in the hilly areas at elevation of 3500 feet above the sea level.

ii) **Irrigated Plantations**

Man-made forests in the shape of blocks in the canal irrigated track.

iii) **Riverian Forests**

Forests occurring in varied sized patches along the river banks.

iv) **Linear Plantations**

Rows of trees planted in the land strips, alongside canals, roads and railway lines.

v) **Range Lands**

Naturally vegetated lands uncultivated due to adverse ecological conditions useable for the production of forage for animal consumption.

B- Production and Value of Timber & Firewood

The information about the production and value of timber and firewood related to Forest Department managed forests only.

EXPLANATORY NOTES ON FUEL AND POWER SECTION

This section includes data on the following topics:

- 1) Gas Consumption by Consumer Group
- 2) Installed Generating Capacity of Power Stations, National Grid, WAPDA
- 3) New Electricity Connections Given and Applications Pending with WAPDA by Consumer Group
- 4) Electricity Consumers and Units Sold by Categories, WAPDA System
- 5) Electricity Revenue Assessed by Type of Consumers, WAPDA
- 6) Generation of Energy in Pakistan and the Punjab under WAPDA System
- 7) Villages Settlements Electrified by Province.

Definitions of important terms used in this section are as under:-

A - Power Stations

i) Principal Hydel

The Power Stations utilising water heads available at the Dams come under Principal Hydel. The Prime movers of the generators are run by discharging water through water turbines.

ii) Small Hydel

The Power stations utilising water heads available from the small Dams across canals come under small Hydel. The Prime movers of the generators are run by discharging water through water turbines.

iii) Thermal

Thermal stations are based on steam turbines utilising steam raised in boilers using Sui Gas as a fuel in the boilers.

iv) Gas

Unlike the conventional thermal stations, natural (Sui) Gas is burnt and is expanded directly in the gas turbines which are prime movers for the generators.

v) **Diesel**

Conventional Diesel Engines using high speed diesel oil are used as prime movers for the generators.

B - Tariff

i) **Domestic**

General Supply for the purpose of this Tariff, means a supply for lamps, fans and other single phase appliances such as heaters, cookers, radiators, airconditioners, refrigerators and domestic tubewells etc. The rated capacity of any motor used in such appliances shall not, however, exceed 4 kilowatts.

ii) **Commercial**

General supply for the purpose of this Tariff, means a supply for lamps, fans and other single phase appliances such as heaters, cookers, radiators, airconditioners, refrigerators and tubewells for non-agricultural purposes etc. The rated capacity of any motor used in such appliances shall not, however, exceed 4 kilowatts.

iii) **Industrial**

'Industrial Supply' for the purpose of this Tariff, means a supply for bonafide industrial purposes in factories, and also for water pumps, and tubewells operating on three phase 400 volts other than those meant for the irrigation and reclamation of agricultural land, and includes a supply for lamps and fans required for the offices and for the normal working of the industry upto but not exceeding a total of 5 per cent of the total units consumed for motor power during a month.

iv) **Agricultural**

Means a supply for Light Irrigation Pumps and/or Tubewells intended solely for irrigation or reclamation of agricultural land or forests and includes supply for lighting of the tubewells chamber which shall also be charged at the above rates.

v) **Public Lighting**

Means a supply given to a local body charged with Public Lighting for the purpose of illuminating Public lamps within the area of its jurisdiction.

vi) **Traction**

The electricity supplied to railways for running trains e.g. Lahore-Khanewal section.

vii) **Bulk**

For the purpose of this Tariff, means a supply given in bulk at one point to:-

- a) Licensee (Licenced under Part II of the Electricity Act, 1910) for the Purpose of further distribution and resale in his area of supply.
- b) A Non-Licensee (Permitted under Part II of the Electricity Act, 1980) to engage in the business of supplying energy for the purpose of further distribution and resale in his area of supply.
- c) Other Consumers e.g. Railways, M.E.S., P.A.F., Cantonment Boards and other Government and Semi-Government and approved institutions having their own distribution facilities for the purpose of further distribution within their respective jurisdiction.

viii) **Tariff `H'**

For one point supply to residential colonies attached to premises of industrial supply Consumers who have their own distribution facilities with their own colonies (A.C. supply).

C - Gas

i) **Domestic Consumers**

Domestic consumers include residential colonies, mosques, churches, temples, madrassas, other religious places and hostels attached thereto, Govt. and Semi-Govt. offices, hospitals, Govt. Guest Houses, Armed Forces Messes/Langers, Universities, Colleges, Schools, Orphanages and other charitable institutions.

ii) **Commercial Consumers**

All establishments registered as commercial units with local authorities or dealing in consumers items for direct commercial sale like cafes, bakeries, milk shops, tea stalls canteens, barber shops, laundries, tandoors, places of entertainment like cinemas, clubs and theatres, all private offices, clinics and maternity homes.

iii) **Industrial Consumers**

All consumers engaged in the processing of industrial raw material into value-added finished products irrespective of the volume of gas consumed.

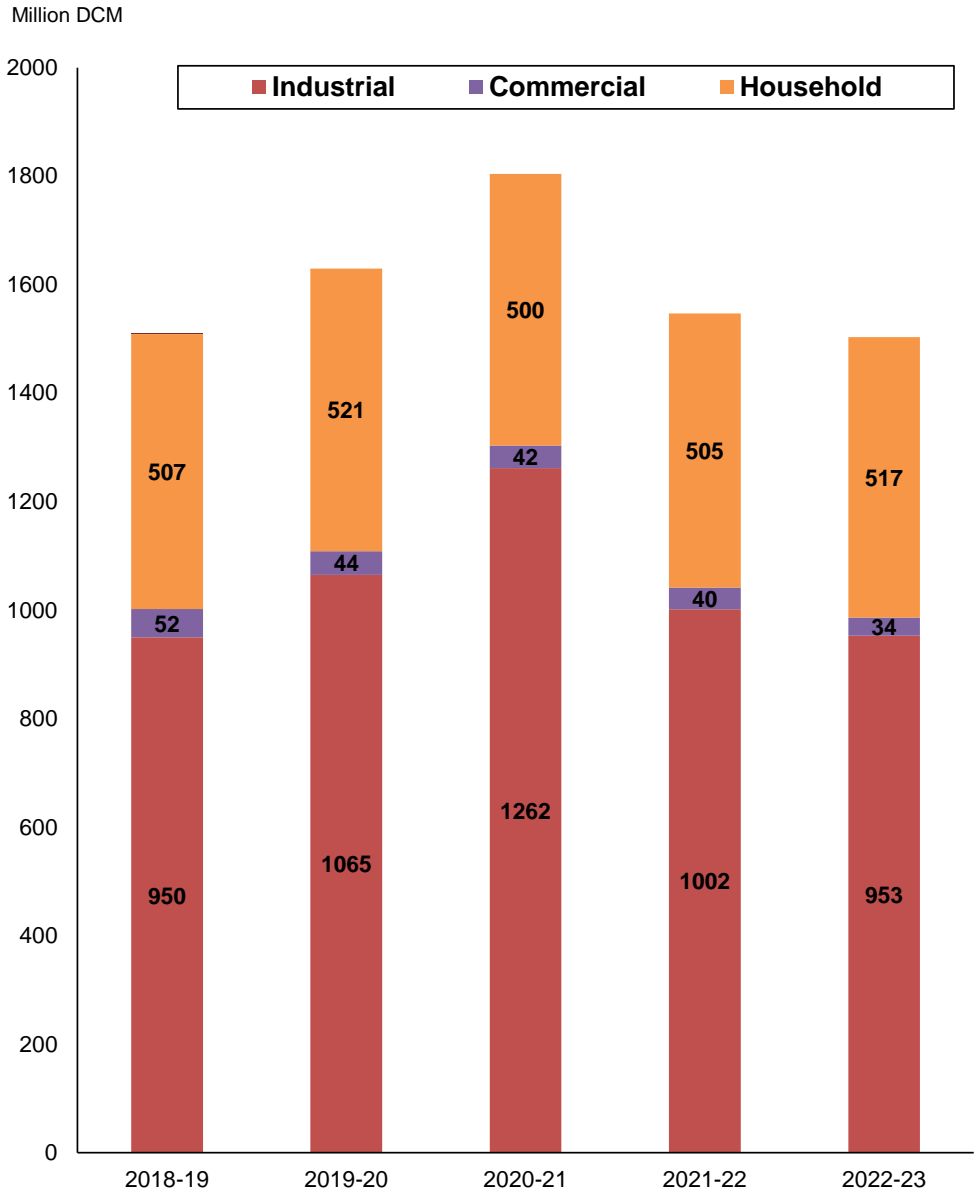

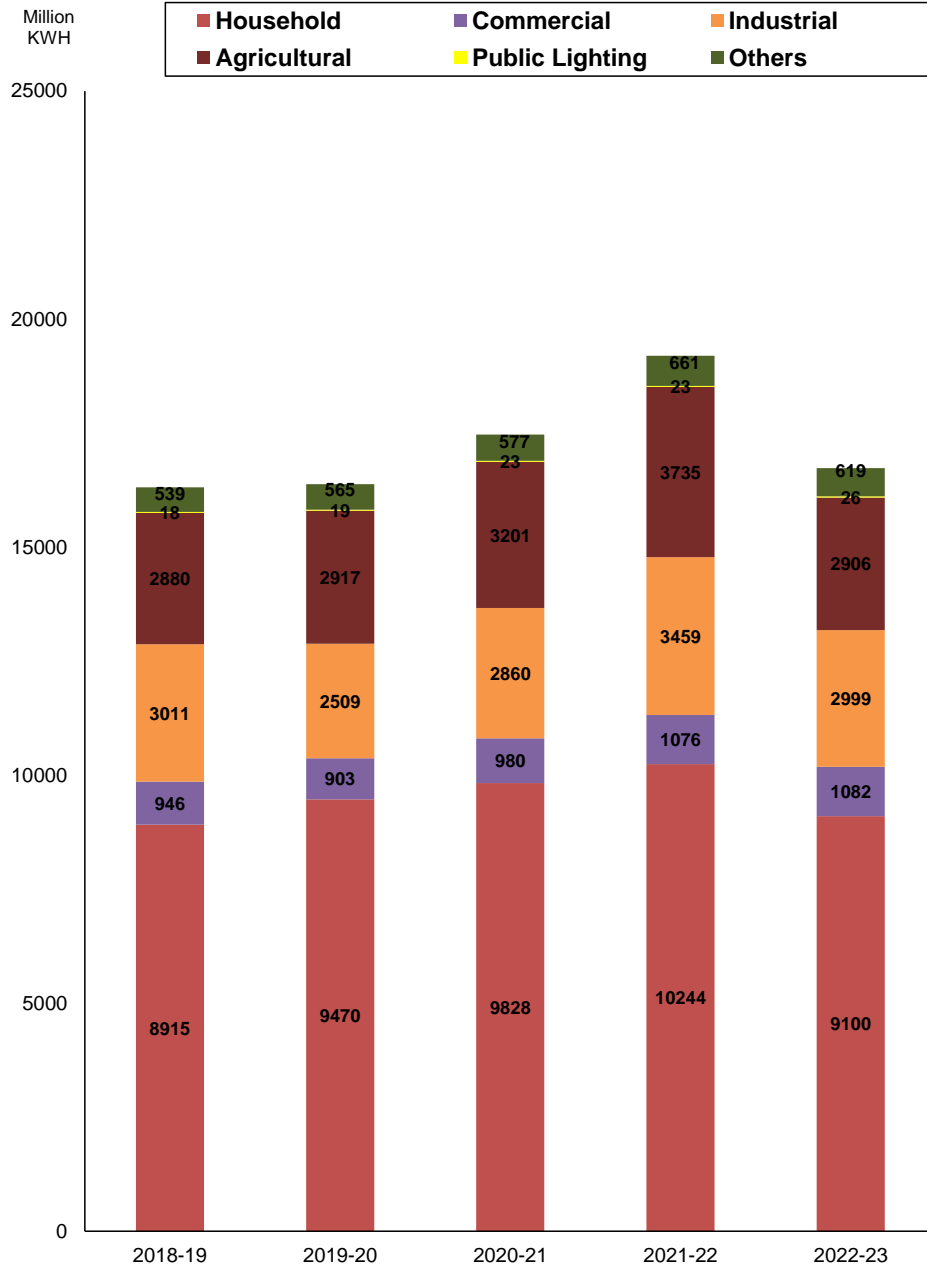

- 4) Number of COVID-19 Risk Management Solutions

A- Coverage

These statistics relate to Hospitals, Dispensaries, T.B. Clinics, Rural Health Centres, Basic Health Units, Sub-Health centres and Maternity & Child Health Centres located in Punjab and administered by Health Department, Home Department, Auqaf Department, Local Bodies, Pakistan Railways, WAPDA, Punjab Employees' Social Security and Private Institutions aided by Government and located in Punjab and South Punjab province.

Note:- Health Institutions belonging to the federal Government, Defence Services and Private Doctors are not being covered.

B- Data Collection System

i) Health Department

Health Institutions belonging to Health Department in the province are required to keep record of all the out-door and in-door patients in an 'Abstract Register'. From the information recorded in the 'Abstract Register' D.G office Health CEO Health field office and other relevant registers, all types of Health Institutions are required to supply annual statistical returns to the District Health Offices. The information supplied relates to number of patients treated for various diseases, number & type of operations performed etc. District Health Officers to the Provincial Health Directorate for consolidation at Provincial level. The statistics related to COVID-19 are collected from Primary & Secondary Healthcare Department.

ii) Other Departments/Organizations

Pakistan Railways, Home Department, WAPDA and Punjab Employees' Social Security collect the annual Statistics from their health institutions and compile the data by tehsil/district/division/province levels at their Head Offices.

Definitions:-

i) **Health Institution**

A health institution is defined as an institution which provides health services i.e. curative and preventive to all/specific class of the public as out-door/ in-door patients.

ii) **Hospital**

Hospital is an institution having ten or more than ten beds. This definition will however, not be applicable where an institution has specifically been named by the Government e.g. Rural Health Centre, Mustafabad, Tehsil and District Kasur having eighteen (18) beds.

iii) **Dispensary**

A dispensary is an institution having less than ten beds.

iv) **Trauma Centers**

A trauma center is a hospital equipped and staffed to provide care for patients suffering from major traumatic injuries such as falls, motor vehicle collisions, or gunshot wounds. A trauma center may also refer to an emergency department (also known as a "casualty department" or "accident and emergency") without the presence of specialized services to care for victims of major trauma.

v) **COVID-19**

Coronavirus disease (COVID-19) is an infectious disease caused by a newly discovered coronavirus called severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus 2 (SARS-CoV-2. formerly called 2019-nCoV), which was first identified amid an outbreak of respiratory illness cases in Wuhan City, Hubei Province, China.

vi) **COVID-19 Test Positive Rate**

The number of confirmed cases divided by the number of tests performed, expressed as a percentage.

vii) **Covid-19 Case Fatality Rate**

The Case Fatality Rate (CFR) is the ratio between confirmed deaths and confirmed cases.

viii) **Covid-19 Risk Management Solutions**

Refers to the practice of identifying potential risks for COVID-19 in advance, analyzing them and taking precautionary steps to reduce/curb the risk. For which Government allocated health facilities (Existing Hospitals + Special Hospitals for COVID-19 patients), beds and other equipments.

The number of confirmed cases divided by the number of tests performed, expressed as a percentage.

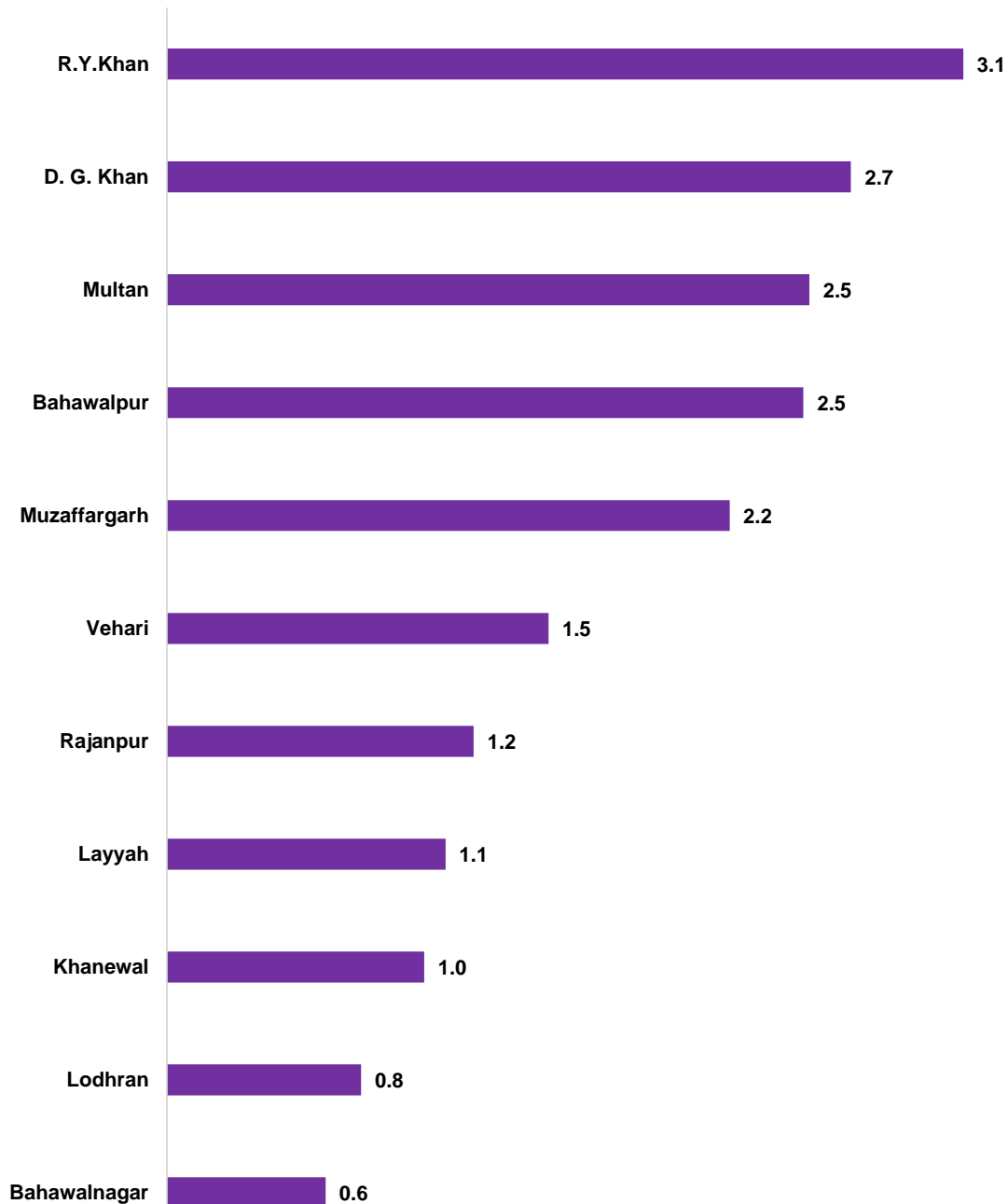
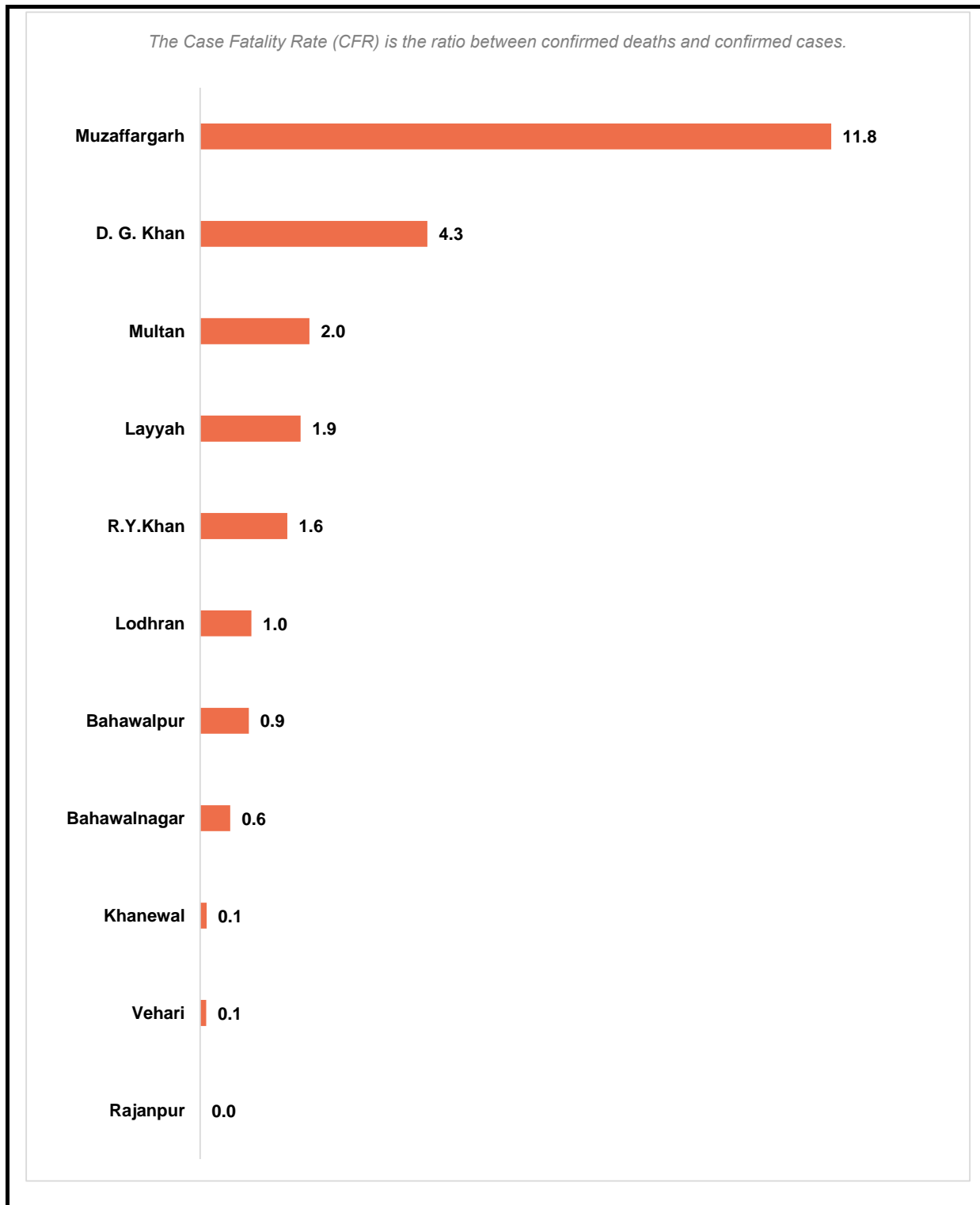

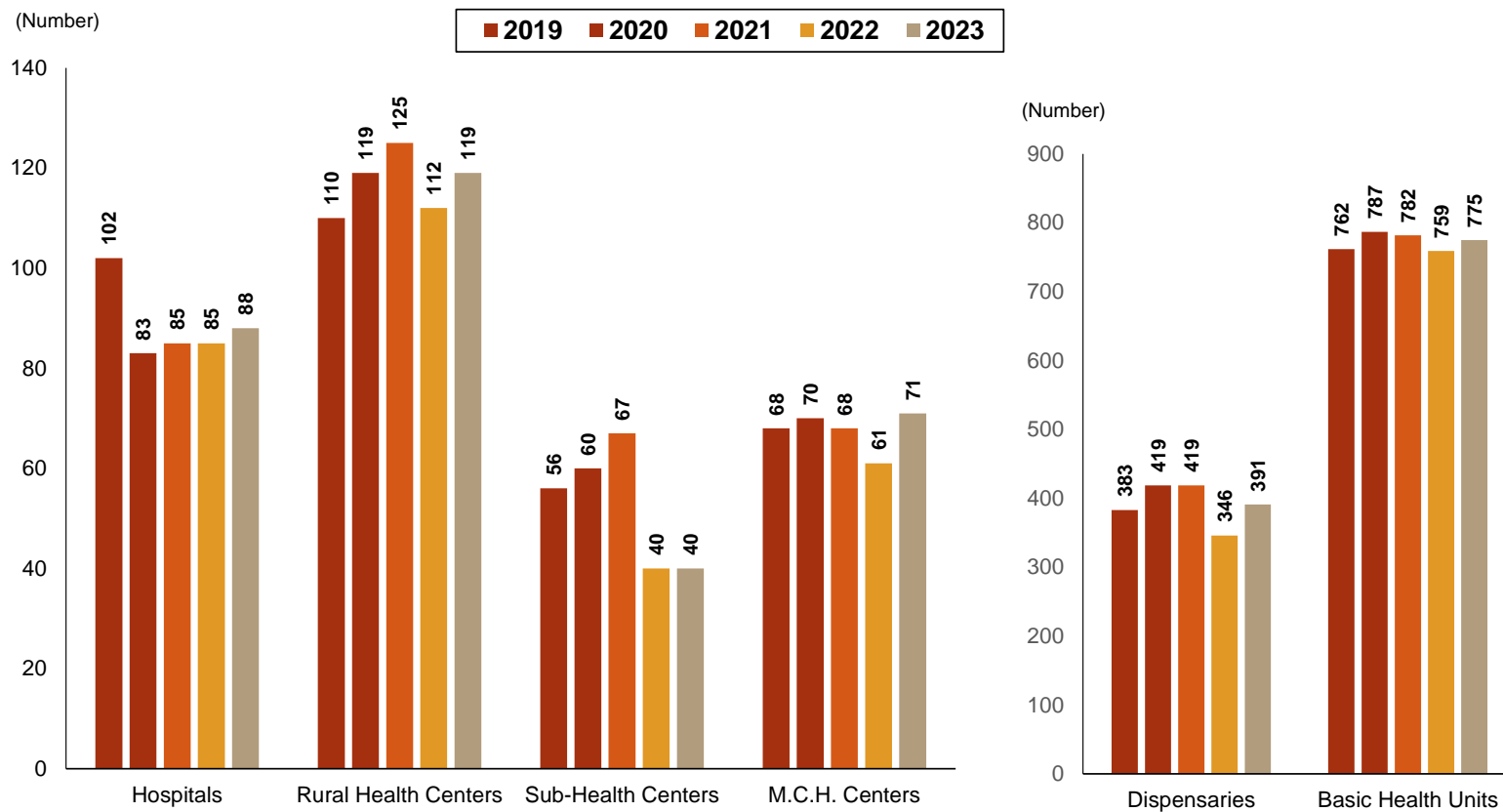

2018-19 TO 2022-23**

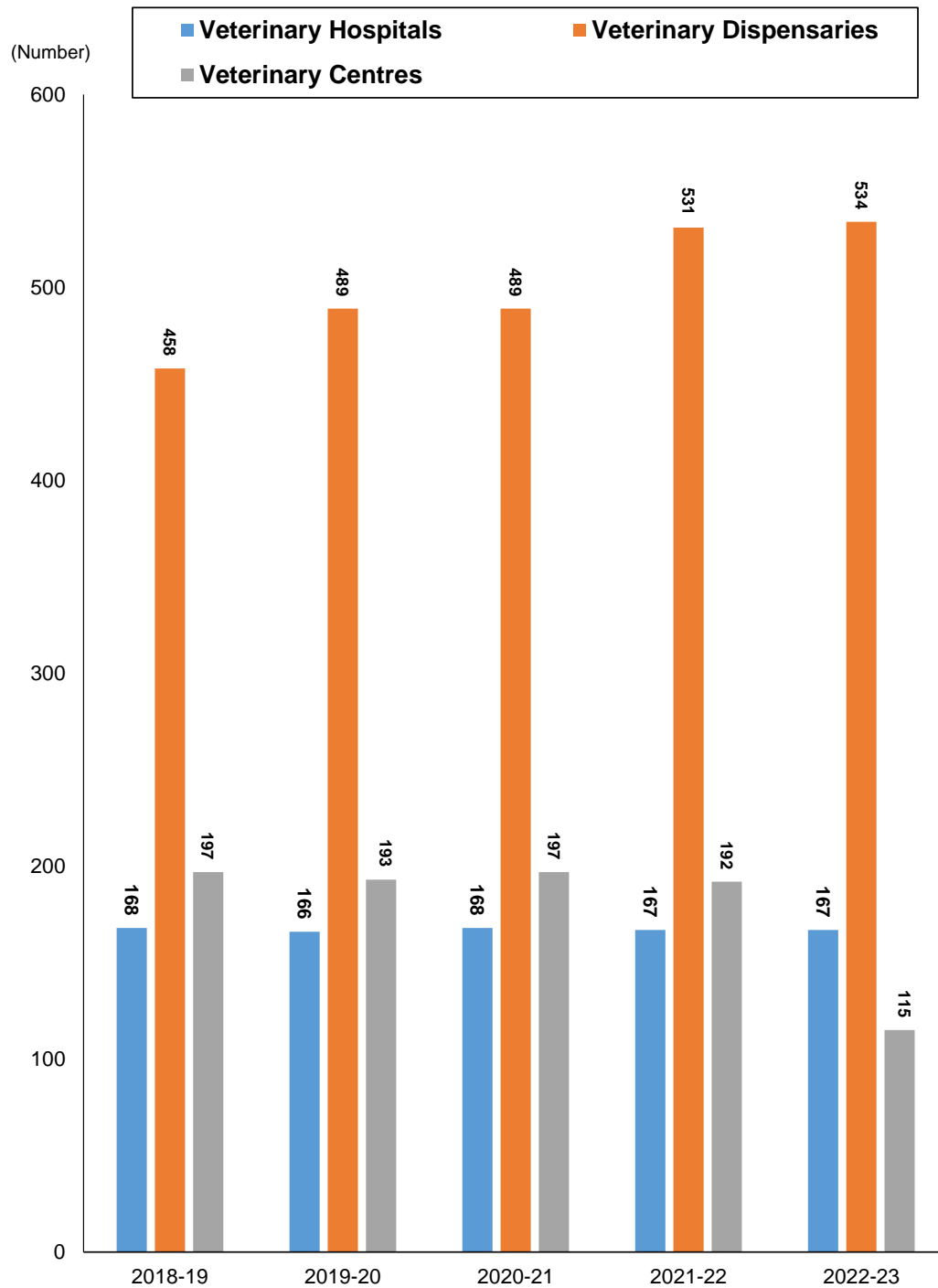

EXPLANATORY NOTES ON MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES SECTION

This section includes statistics on the following topics:-

- 1) Monthly Survey of Industrial Production and Employment.
- 2) Census of Manufacturing Industries (CMI).
- 3) Registered Factories and their Employment by District and Industry.
- 4) Industrial Credit.

Monthly Survey of Industrial Production and Employment

Statistical tables included in this section contain data on production and employment for the years 2015-16 to 2022-23 and monthly data for the year 2022-23 against 35 items, manufactured by 20 selected large scale industries in the Punjab. These industries accounted for almost 53.68% of "Total Value Added" in manufacturing sector in the province during 2005-06. Employment during the year are monthly averages.

This information is collected through Bureau's Monthly Survey of Industrial Production and Employment which was started in October, 1971. Industry-wise proforma are used for the purpose. Data from non-responding factories is collected by Bureau's Officials through personal visits. The results of the survey for a month are generally finalized by the end of the following month. Employment data for a factory is shown only once against the industry in which it is classified on the basis of its major products even though it produces more than one item.

Coverage and Steps for Improvement:-

Coverage is maximum in respect of Cotton Cloth (mill sector), Leather Tanning, Sugar, Cement, Sulphuric Acid, Fertilizers, Bicycles, Soft Drinks and Fruit Juices. Continuous efforts are being made to maximise the coverage of best of the industries.

Efforts are also made to keep the list of factories up-to date in consultation with Central Board of Revenue, PICIC, Zarai Taraqati Bank, Directorate of Labour Welfare Punjab and print media as well. Moreover, scope of the Monthly Survey of Industrial Production and Employment is gradually being extended to some more Industries according to the directions of Government.

Census of Manufacturing Industries (CMI)

This section contains tables on summary statistics (Fixed Assets, Employment, Employment Cost, Industrial Cost, Value of Production, Gross Value Added of establishments registered or qualify for registration under factories Act 1934. The Census is conducted by Pakistan Bureau of Statistics, in collaboration with provincial Directorate of Industries and Bureau of Statistics, under the industrial Act 1942 and General Statistics Act 1975, as a Joint effort as per following.

a) Pakistan Bureau of Statistics:-

- i) Planning of Census in collaboration with Provincial Bureaus of Statistics and Directorates of Industries.
- ii) Preparation of Questionnaire, Tabulation Plan and Editing Instructions in consultation with all concerned Federal Ministries, Provincial Departments and Autonomous and Private Organizations.
- iii) Preparation and Publication of CMI tables at national level.

b) Directorate of Industries, Punjab:-

- i) Notification of the questionnaires.
- ii) Printing and Mailing out of Questionnaires
- iii) Collection of CMI returns.
- iv) Preliminary editing of CMI returns.

c) Bureau of Statistics, Punjab:-

- i) Statistical examination of CMI returns.
- ii) Computer processing of CMI returns.
- iii) Preparation of CMI Tables for PBS.

Scope & Coverage:

All factories, carrying on manufacturing or repairing activities and registered or eligible for registration under Section 2 (J) or 5 (i) under the Factories Act 1934 (Amended in 1973), are covered under the Census. It, however, excludes Defence and other Government establishments including Railway workshops which provide ancillary facilities and do not manufacture or repair anything for commercial purpose.

Definitions:

Important terms used in the section are defined as under:-

i) Registered Factories

An establishment is said to be registered under Section 2 (J) of Factories Act 1934, (Amended in 1973) if ten or more workers are working on any day of the preceding twelve months and in any part of which manufacturing process is being carried out with or without the aid of power or is ordinarily so carried out, but does not include Mine subject, which comes under the operation of Mines Act, 1923, whereas the establishments having employment between 5-9 workers during the year are eligible for registration under section 5 (i) of the Factories Act, 1934.

ii) Gross Value of Fixed Assets

It includes the gross value of land, building, plant, machinery, transport and other fixed assets i.e. equipment, furniture etc., as at the end of the year.

iii) Employees

It means all persons whether part time or full time who work in the establishments and receive remuneration in cash or in kind. Working proprietors, unpaid family workers and home workers are excluded.

iv) Average Daily Persons Employed

It includes employees, working proprietors and unpaid family workers.

v) Employment Cost

It includes wages and salaries paid plus cash and non-cash benefits paid to the workers.

vi) Industrial Cost

It consists of cost of raw materials, fuels and electricity consumed, payments for work done, payments for repairs and maintenance and cost of goods purchased for re-sale.

vii) Value of Production

It consists of the value of finished products and by-products, receipts for work done for others, receipts for repairs and maintenance, value of sale of semi-finished products and by-products, wastes and used goods, value of electricity sold, value of sales of goods purchased for re-sale, the net increase in the value of work in process and the value of fixed assets produced by the establishment for its own final use (investment).

viii) Census Value Added at Producer Price

It equals value of industrial production minus industrial cost.

| Limitations of CMI

- i) The mailing list used for the census may not be up to date.
- ii) The reported data contained reporting errors and inconsistencies, which were corrected on the basis of available supplementary information or/and past data.
- iii) Census results become available with a time-lag of 2-3 years due to the time taken for collection, editing and tabulation processes.
- iv) Size and nature of non-response varies from year to year. Since non-response surveys could not be conducted for all the years, the Census results were not adjusted for non-response, they may not be comparable from year to year.

The Bureau of Statistics has taken the following steps during recent years to improve the Census Results:-

- i) List of registered factories is being kept up-to date.
- ii) Reported data is subjected to manual as well as computer statistical editing, before final tabulation. Missing information estimated.
- iii) The cases, where reporting errors cannot be corrected without changing the reported information significantly, managements of the concerned units are asked to reconcile the discrepancies observed in their data. Corrections are made in the light of their replies.
- iv) Efforts are being made to complete editing and tabulation as early as possible, after receipt of returns from Directorate of Industries, Punjab.

Tables on Distribution of registered factories employing persons less than hundred, and hundred or more by district and major industry group as on 30th June, 2017 and 2018 have also been added to identify the areas of industrial concentration and the type of industrial activity. PAKISTAN & THE SOUTH PUNJAB : 2022-23**

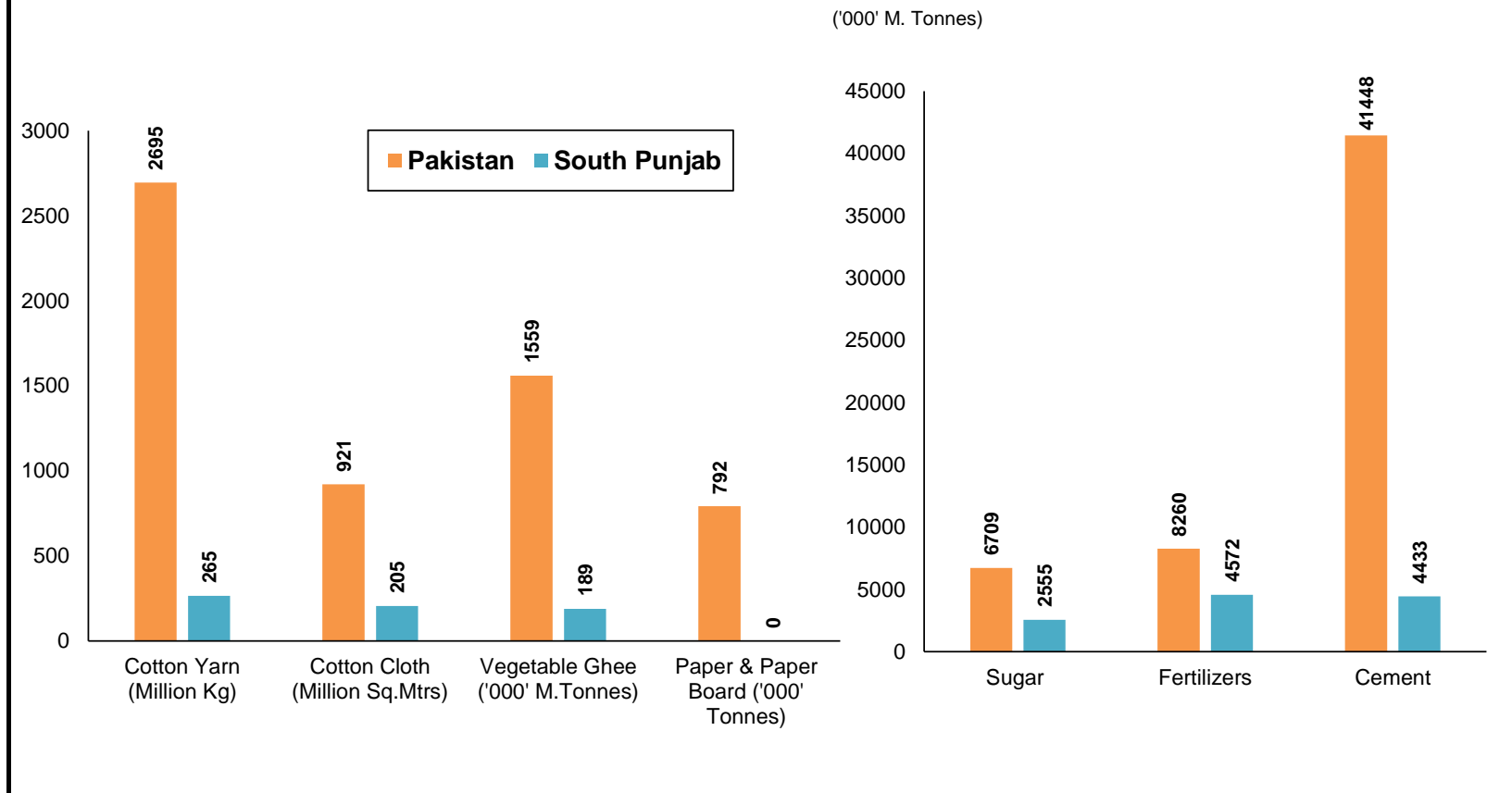

EXPLANATORY NOTES ON POPULATION SECTION

Population Censuses and Their Time Schedule

A population census is defined in the UN documents as the total process of collecting, compiling, evaluating, analysing and disseminating demographic, economic and social data pertaining, to all persons in a country at a specific time. The last census conducted in British rule was the one in 1941. Pakistan continued the British tradition of holding censuses, the first census in Pakistan was conducted in 1951 and the last in 2023. So far Seven censuses have been conducted in Pakistan according to the following schedule:

1951, 1961, 1972, 1981, 1998, 2017 & 2023 CENSUS**

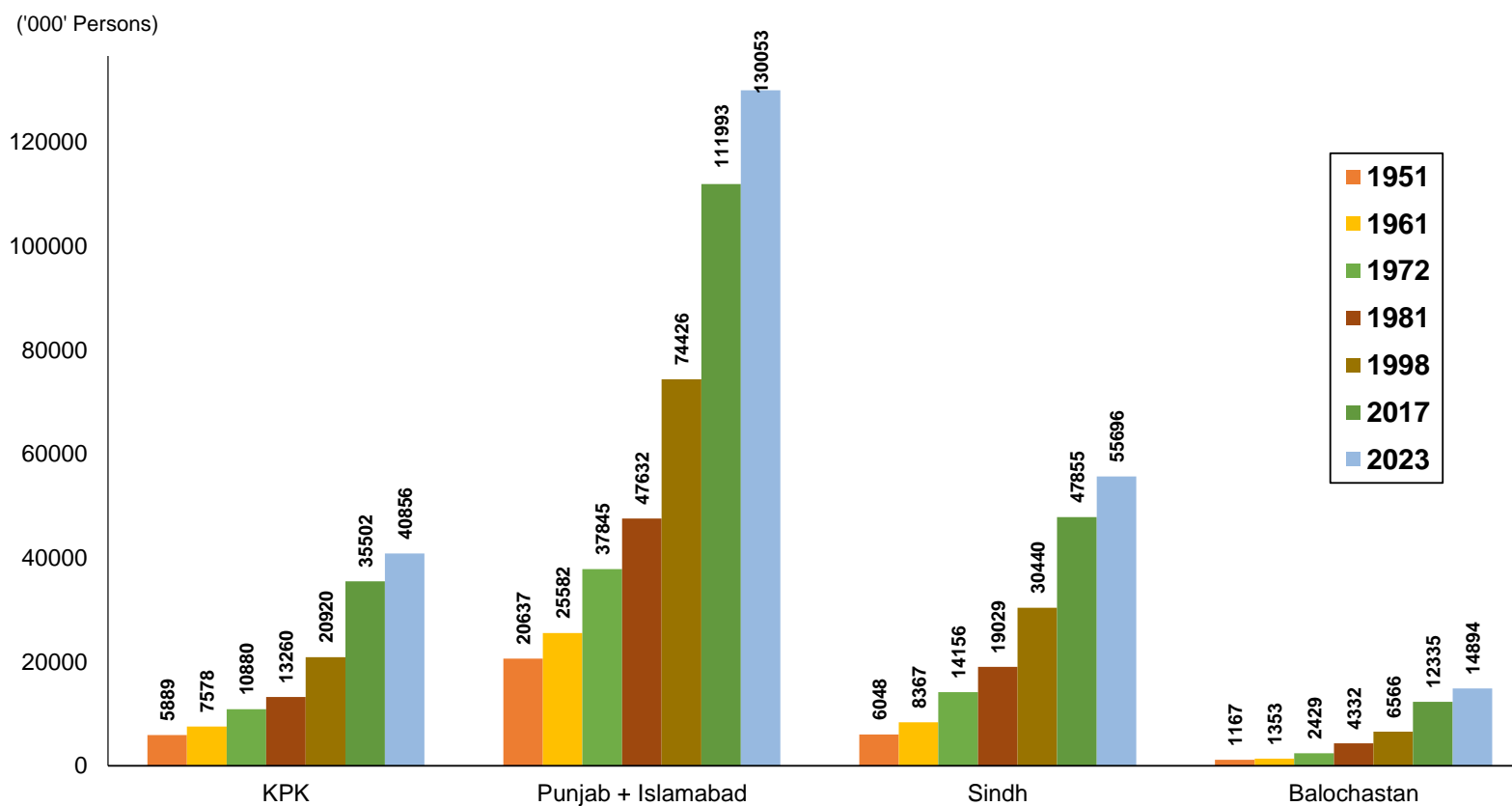

EXPLANATORY NOTES ON PRICES SECTION

This section includes data on the following topics:-

- 1) Average Retail Prices of nine essential commodities.
- 2) Index Numbers of Wholesale Prices.
- 3) Inflation Rates.
- 4) Combined Consumer Price Index Numbers.
- 5) Spot Bullion Quotations.
- 6) Weekly Exchange Rates of U.S. Dollar.
- 7) Monthly Average Wholesale Prices of Wheat, Rice (Basmati), Kappas (American) and Gram (Whole).

A- Retail Prices

Bureau of Statistics, Punjab collects retail prices of 70 items in summer and 67 items in winter season of selected commodities at nine major cities / divisional headquarters of the province. The prices are daily collected by the staff, posted at these major cities and transmit it to the headquarters' office at Lahore. Daily Price situation report is submitted to the concerned authorities of the govt. Institutions. This section includes yearly data on average Retail Prices of nine essential commodities i.e. wheat flour, gram, sugar white, vegetable ghee (Loose), mutton, beef, kerosene oil, potato and onion for the years 2016-17 to 2022-23 and monthly data for the years 2022-23 (July - June) and 2023 (July - December).

B- Consumer Price Index (CPI)

Consumer Price Index Numbers are prepared in order to measure the percentage change in the cost of purchasing a constant basket of goods and services of a particular population during a given period of time.

Series of Consumer Price Index Numbers having 202 items with price base 1969-70 and weight base 1972 was started in 1973 by Federal Bureau of Statistics. Another series of CPI with price base 1975-76 and weight base 1978 covering 357 items was started. Later on, other series with 1980-81 as base year covering 466 consumer items, 1990-91 as base year covering 367 consumer items, 2000-01 as base year covering 374 consumer items and 2007-08 as base year covering 487 consumer items were taken up

The governing council of Pakistan Bureau of Statistics in its 5th meeting in 2014 issued a policy directive to rebase the National Accounts and Price Statistics after every ten years and decided the year 2015-16 as the next base year. Now PBS has completed the process of rebasing of price statistics from 2007-08 to 2015-16.

Governing Council in its 18th meeting held on August 30, 2019 approved the change of base of price statistics from 2007-08 to 2015-16 with following salient features:-

- a. Introduction of Rural Consumer Price Index (RCPI) for the first time in the history of the country.
- b. Introduction of National Consumer Price Index (NCPI) along with Urban Consumer Price Index (UCPI) and Rural Consumer Price Index (RCPI).
- c. Introduction of Population weights based on recent population census, 2017.
- d. Computation of indices based on Weighted Geometric Mean.
- e. Introduction of consumption quintiles instead of income quintiles.
- f. Introduction of consumer weighted approach to compute Gas prices.
- g. Rationalization of electricity prices and introduction of consumer weighted approach to compute prices
- h. Electronic data collection (Android Based) for the first time in the history of PBS.

Hence, with the inception of new base year 2015-16, Pakistan Bureau of Statistics has been collecting the retail and wholesale prices since July 2016 and computing the following five indices on monthly/weekly basis:

- i. **Urban** – Consumer Price Index (UCPI)
- ii. **Rural** – Consumer Price Index (RCPI)
- iii. **National** – Consumer Price Index (NCPI)
- iv. **Wholesale** Price Index (WPI)
- v. **Sensitive** Price Indicator (SPI)

With the introduction of Rural markets in the new base, PBS is collecting prices from both rural and urban markets to compute CPI. The urban CPI area covers 35 no. of cities, 68 no. of markets, 356 no. of items, 94 no. of commodities and 12 no. of group & while Rural CPI covers 27 no. of rural areas, 27 no. of markets, 244 no. of items.

The series have twelve major expenditure groups viz. (i) Food & Non-Alcoholic Beverages, (ii) Alcoholic Beverages, Tobacco, (iii) Clothing & Footwear, (iv) Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas & Other Fuels, (v) Furnishing & Household Equipment Maintenance, (vi) Health, (vii) Transport, (viii) Communications, (ix) Recreation & Culture, (x) Education, (xi) Restaurants & Hotels, (xii) Miscellaneous Goods & Services.

Formula used for Computation of Index:-

Laspeyre's formula as given below is being used by PBS, for the computation of Urban & Rural CPI:

Where

P_n = Price of an item in the nth Period

$\sum W_i$ = Total weight of all items

Compilation of National CPI:

Urban & Rural CPI's are used to compile National CPI. Weighted Geometric Mean is computed to obtain National CPI, using proportion of urban & rural consumption received through HICS are their respective weights

C- Wholesale Price Index (WPI)

The wholesale Price Index (WPI) is designed to measure the directional movement of prices for a set of selected items in the primary and wholesale markets. Items covered in the series are those which could be precisely defined and are offered in lots by producers/manufacturers. Prices used are generally those, which conform to the primary seller's realization at ex-mandi, ex-factory or at an organized Wholesale level.

The WPI was computed with 1959-60 as base. Since then, continuous efforts have been made to make the WPI more representative by improving & expanding its scope & coverage in items of commodities, quotations/markets, etc. subsequently, WPI series were computed with 1969-70, 1975-76, 1990-91, 2000-01 and 2007-06 as base years. Presently, the WPI is being computed with 2015-16 as base.

The wholesale prices are being collected from wholesale markets of 19 cities, covering 419 items in the base 2015-16. These items are divided into 5 major group's viz. (i) Agriculture Forestry & Fisheries Products, (ii) Ores & Minerals, Electricity, Gas & Water, (iii) Food Products, Beverages & Tobacco, (iv) Other Transportable Goods except Metal Products, Machinery & equipment, (v) Metal Products, Machinery & Equipment.

D- Rate of Inflation

Rate of inflation can be measured through CPI, WPI or implicit deflator of GDP, but the common practice to measure inflation is through CPI as given in this bulletin.

For 2018-19 (Base: 2007-08=100) and For 2019-20 To 2022-23 (Base: 2015-16=100)

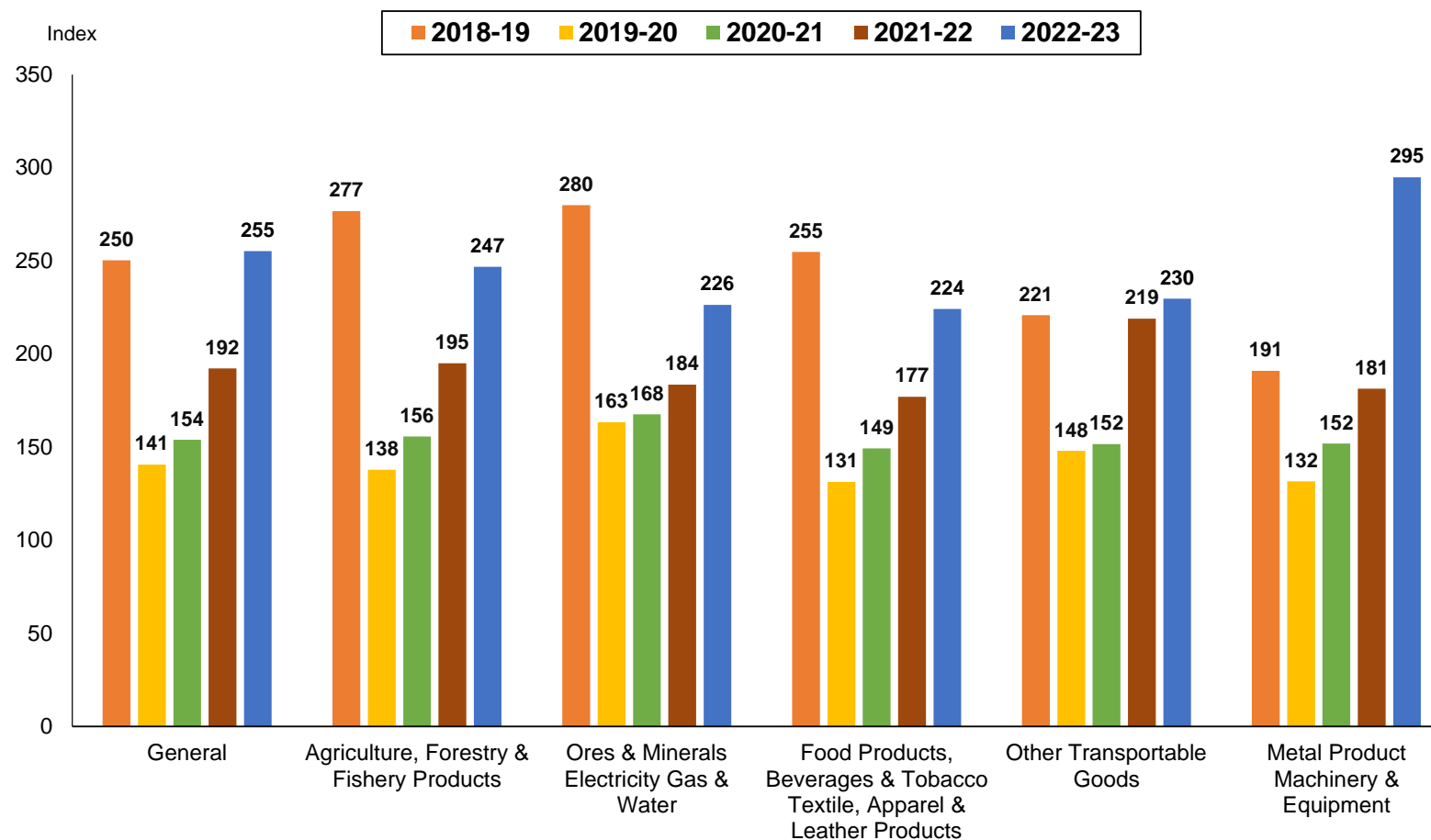
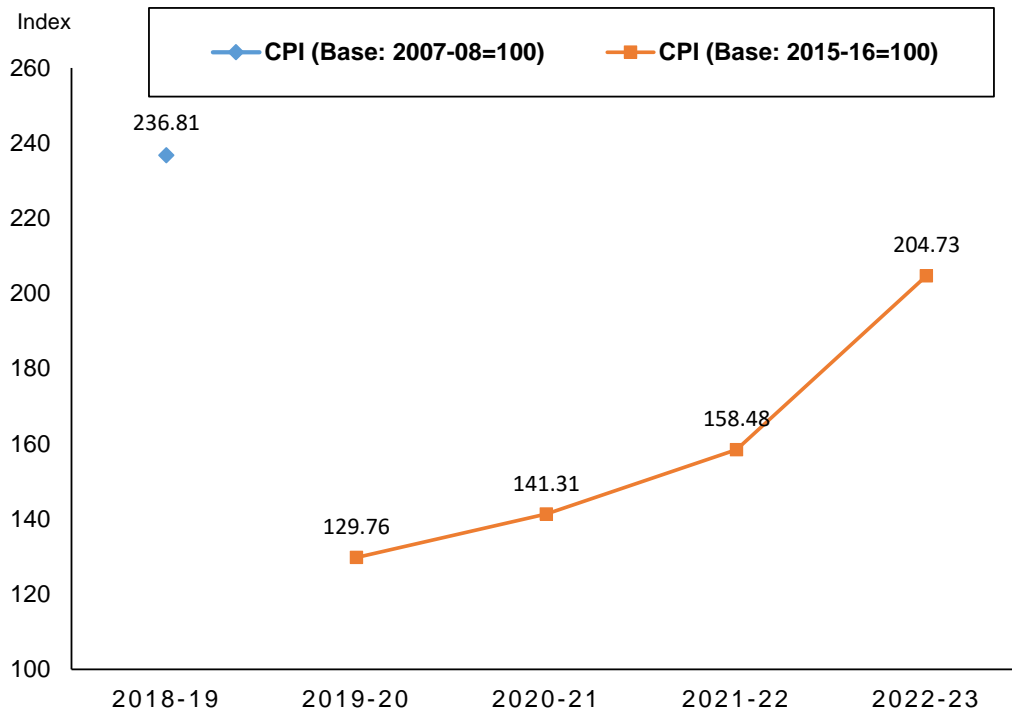

2018-19 To 2022-23**

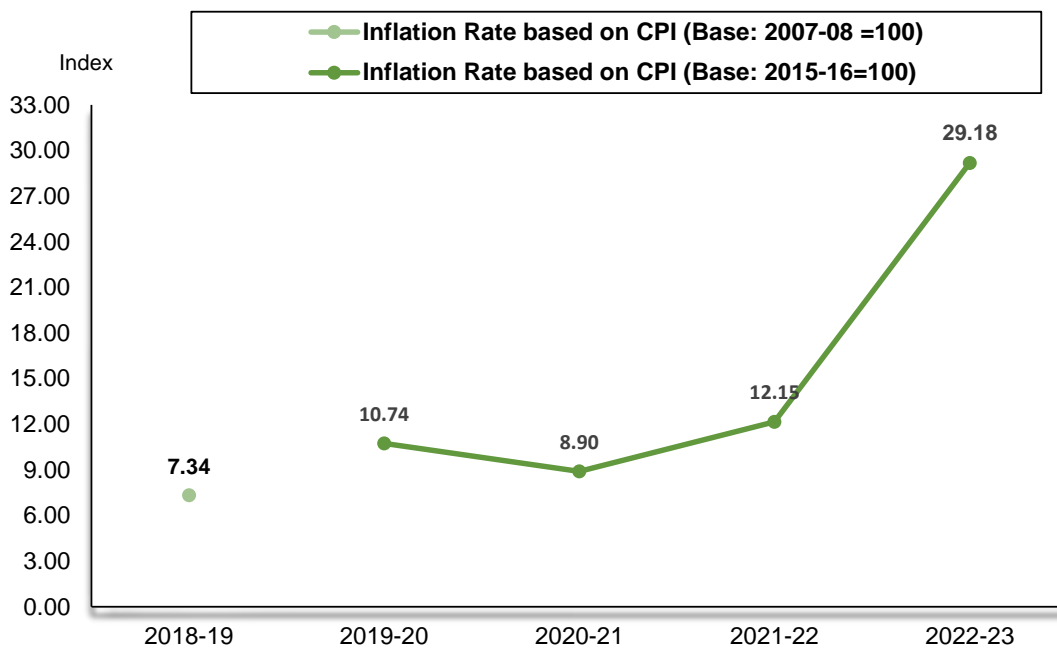

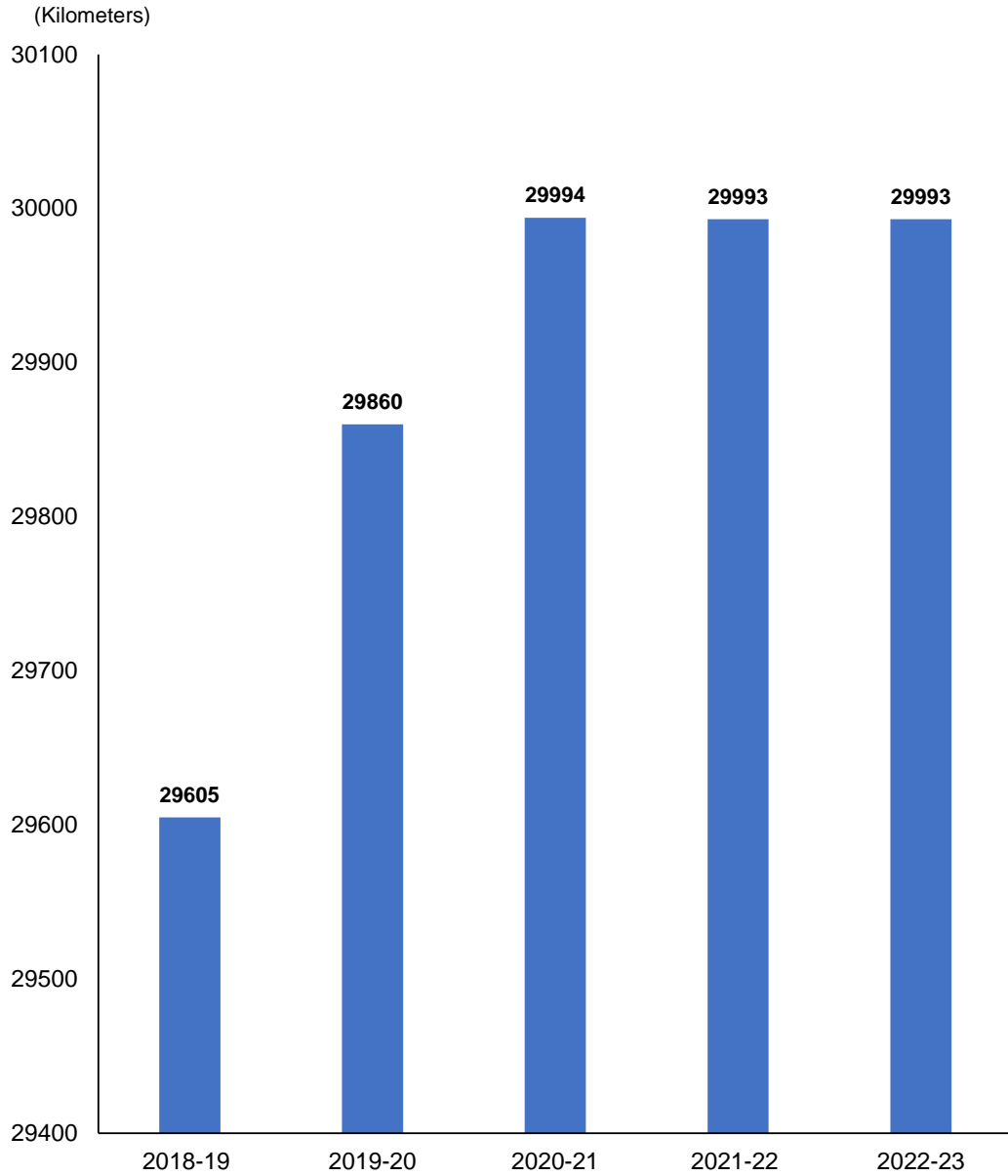
